



Declaration of Intent to Provide Home-Based Instruction

A parent who intends to cause his/her children to receive home-based instruction in lieu of attendance or enrollment in a public school, approved private school, or an extension program of an approved private school, **must file an annual declaration of intent** to do so in the format prescribed below:

I do hereby declare that I am the parent, guardian, or legal custodian of the child(ren) listed below, that said child(ren) is/are between the ages of eight and eighteen, and as such, subject to the requirements found in Chapter 28A.225RCW – Compulsory Attendance Law. I further declare that I am qualified under the law and intend to provide said child(ren) with home-based instruction as specified in Chapter 28A.225RCW. I further agree to insure that:

- Test scores or annual academic progress assessments and immunization records, together with any other records kept relating to instructional/educational activities provided are forwarded to any other public or private school to which the child transfers
- A standardized achievement test approved by the State Board of Education, be administered annually to the child by a qualified individual, or that an annual assessment of the student’s academic progress shall be written by a certificated person who is currently working in the field of education. The standardized test results or the annual academic progress assessment report shall be made a part of the child’s permanent records.

I agree to the conditions as set forth in this declaration as well as those conditions stated in Chapter 28A.225RCW. This statement must be filed **annually** with the superintendent of the public school district within which the parent/guardian/custodian resides by **September 15 or within two weeks of the beginning of any public school quarter, trimester or semester.
