- In recent elections, the size & influence of the 18 – 29 year old group of voters has rivaled that of the much-coveted senior citizen vote over 65 years old
- According to the 2013 Virginia Attorney General, a difference of 907 votes out of 2.2 million cast which was 0.04% of the vote
- In the N.J. Assembly in 2013 a 40 vote difference out of 50,288 representing 0.07% of the vote
- In 2012, the 18-29 age group represented 19% of total turnout, highest ever (18% in 2008); Barack Obama won 60% of this group
- In 2006, the youth vote was the deciding factor in several races:

--- In the Virginia Senate race, Webb defeated Allen by 9329 votes; 18 – 29 turnout was up by 110,453 votes over 2002

--- In the 2006 Congressional race in Connecticut's Second District, Joe Courtney won by 83 votes; turnout at the University of Connecticut polling place was up ten times that number
