1. Welcome and Introductions (S. Fifield)

 - ✓ A. Greer motioned, D. Williams seconded

2. General Business and Discussion (S. Fifield)

- Email Update on Parking from Ms. Voorhies
 - ✓ See Appendix A at the end of these minutes
- Open Discussion
 - ✓ Utah ASPIRE Plus will be administered in four parts to all sophomores during the school day over a two week period. The testing will require adjustments to the bell schedules beginning Monday, April 1.
 - ✓ Arena scheduling has been set as follows:
 - Seniors – Monday, April 22 and Tuesday, April 23
 - Juniors – Wednesday, April 24 and Thursday, April 25
 - Sophomores – Friday, April 26 through Monday, April 29
 - Open to all – Monday, May 6 through Friday, August 23
 - ✓ Working in conjunction with the Principal's Round Table, posters addressing dress code are being finalized. Beta versions were passed around to council members and feedback taken.
 - ✓ The school is looking to hold a Standards Assembly for sophomores at the outset of each new school year.
 - Council members liked the idea and suggested clarification on dress code, cell phone policy, and facsimiles of weapons.
 - ✓ A. Greer suggested that J. Groethe move 'Open Discussion' to the end of the agenda moving forward. He will do so.

3. Guidance Update (N. Coughran)

- University of Utah invited CHHS students to their annual People of the Pacific Conference on Friday, March 28. 29 students attended the day of activities which included cultural experiences and college/career workshops.
- Derek Bennett (Counselor) attended a crisis response event on behalf of the school on Thursday, March 7. He will provide training for the remainder of the counseling team.

- Weber State University has invited CHHS juniors to their Purple Carpet event on March 20. Students who participate will be able to experience a day on the campus and attend seminars and classes. At the time of this meeting, 40 students had committed to attend.
 - Sophomore Orientation is scheduled for Tuesday, April 2. Information has been sent via Skylert and. Students and parents will be able to meet counselors, hear about arena scheduling, and meet with advisors and students of clubs, elective courses, teams, and more.
 - CHHS counselors will be holding parent meetings at Sunset Ridge and West Hills Middle School during the month of April to assist students with scheduling questions.
 - The next ACT Test proctored through CHHS is scheduled for Saturday, April 13.
4. 2018-2019 LAND Trust Plan Update (J. Groethe)
- Based on “LAND Trust Mid-Year Provisional Amendment” the council needed to decide on reallocation of PDD budgeted monies in excess of \$5,000 at this meeting.
 - ✓ PDD money as of March 13, 2019 stands at \$7,320
 - ✓ J. Groethe expressed to the council that the school can and will spend down the PDD below the \$5,000 threshold and requested that the council consider leaving the PDD money in place.
 - ✓ Motion to leave the \$7,320 PDD money in place for school use on PDD by D. Williams; seconded by R. Newbold.
5. 2019-2020 LAND Trust Plan Proposal, Discussion, and Approval (J. Groethe)
- Discussed, motioned, and approved the following amendments:
 - ✓ Any carryover monies from the 2018-2019 budget year as well as any increased distribution above the projected allocation will be allocated according to the percentages established by the LAND Trust Plan Budget.
 - ✓ The FTE allocation as listed on the budget is to cover 2.0 FTE. Any additional monies remaining after funding 2.0 FTE will be reallocated in the following priority: 1. TECH, 2. TRIP, 3. FTE.
 - ✓ The School Community Council reserves the right to amend the 2019-2020 LAND Trust Plan throughout the school year.

APPENDIX A

Email correspondence from Janice Voorhies to J. Groethe and S. Fifield:

I spoke to Scott Thomas (Auxiliary Services Administrator) at some length about Copper Hills. The auto shop expansion is on the five year plan, but has not yet be assigned a specific date. The current procedure is that the Board looks at the entire list and determines highest priorities. We will be doing that in the near future.

Your parking problem is at the top of the list. Here is the latest information from Lance Everill, who is our Emergency Operations Manager:

“I spoke with West Jordan City Traffic Engineer Bill Baranowski to get clarification related to traffic flow and parking at Copper Hills. Bill said that they have done traffic studies, held meetings with the public and CHHS admin., and conducted a public survey. Here are the details that I got from Bill:

New Bingham Highway

- UDOT transferred New Bingham Highway over to West Jordan City.
- The name of the street will soon be changed to Copper Hills Parkway.
- Copper Hills Parkway will eventually bridge over Mountain View Corridor to connect with 8600 S on the west side of MVC, possibly within the next 2 years. The city has secured 14 million in funding for this project.
- Copper Hills Parkway will be stubbed at approx. 4300 W, no longer connecting directly with 7800 S at 4000 W.
- City council will consider reducing the speed to 35 MPH (currently 45), which will make it easier and safer to get in and out of CHHS. They will also consider reducing the number of lanes and adding bicycle lanes in both directions.
- The intersection of Copper Hills Parkway and Grizzly will be modified into a "protected intersection", making it safer for pedestrians and cyclists to cross.
- Additional pedestrian crossing features will be added, such as flashing lights.
- The study has concluded that all of these enhancements should improve safety and traffic flow in front of the school.

7800 South

- Starting this spring, the city will begin constructing both east and west lanes at the south end of airport 2. This will make it possible to stub Copper Hills Parkway at 4300 W.

Grizzly Way

- Currently, nothing will change regarding parking on Grizzly Way. The study proposed eliminating parking on the east side of Grizzly, and adding parking on the west side. This will be a city project, but they do not have funding right now.

Additional Parking

- UDOT has given the city the field by the northwest corner of the school, by Arctic Circle. The city is considering the possibility of then leasing/giving the property to JSD, with the idea of it being for additional parking for the school.
