**ACCEPTANCE OF ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSE ENROLLMENT
GUIDELINES**

You have scheduled one or more Advanced Placement level courses.

In order to be enrolled, you and your parents must read and sign this form.

You are able to withdraw from any Advanced Placement course prior June 12, 2019 without penalty.

As a condition of taking any AP course, all students **MUST** take the national AP exam administered in May at their own expense---fee waivers are available from the Guidance Office for students who qualify by meeting financial guidelines.

No final exam will be administered nor will a final exam grade be given on the report card for students in AP classes. If a student refuses to pay for or refuses to take the national AP exam, the following consequences will be applied:

1. The instructor will administer a final exam and a grade from that exam will be entered on the report card.
2. The weighted grade of the course will be removed.
3. If a senior does not take the AP exam, all colleges/universities to which that senior has applied will be informed that the student has withdrawn from the AP course.

Withdrawal from an AP Course

Withdrawals from AP courses after the first day of classes are strongly discouraged.

If a student is withdrawn from an AP course based on the recommendations of the teacher and the student's guidance counselor with the approval of the building principal, the following guidelines apply:

- If a student is withdrawn from an AP course after the first class day of the 2019-2020 school term and is able to be enrolled into a similar course at a lower academic level, the actual quarterly grades earned in the AP course will be transferred to the new course. The grades will **not** be given a weighted advantage (ie. a "B" is transferred as a "B" and not an "A").
- If a student is withdrawn from an AP course after the first class day of the 2019-2020 school term and is unable to be scheduled into a similar course at a lower academic level, the student will be withdrawn from the AP course without penalty.
- If the withdrawal takes place after the first class day of the 2019-2020 school term of the student's senior year, all colleges and universities to which the student has already applied will be informed that the student has withdrawn from the AP course.
- If a child fails to complete any required summer assignment, the student will begin the course with a "0" grade. Should the student withdraw from the AP class, the grade is transferred to the applicable grade level course.
