CLASS OFFERINGS

Courses for Incoming Freshmen (\$250.00 per course)

- Language Arts/Reading Comprehension
- Math Review

These courses are designed to prepare incoming freshmen for their fall courses.

Review Courses for 9th - 12th grades (\$275.00 per course)

The following courses offer students the chance to remediate deficient credits and/or raise a grade for the purpose of college admissions.

- **RELIGION REVIEW** - Rel. 9, 10, 11, 12
- **ENGLISH REVIEW** - English 9, British Lit., American Lit., English 12
- **SOCIAL STUDIES REVIEW** - Intro. to Soc. Stud., World Hist., US Hist., Gov., Econ.
- **FOREIGN LANGUAGE REVIEW** - Spanish I,II,III,IV, Latin I, II, III, IV
- **MATH REVIEW** - Pre-Alg., Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Int. Alg.
- **SCIENCE REVIEW** - Physical Sci., Bio., Chem., Mar. Sci., Anat./Phy.

For the above classes students will be provided with assignments that must be completed in class to earn 5 credits and/or raise a letter grade.

A teacher is assigned to each class to assist the students and to provide instruction when needed. Attendance during summer school is very important. Please refer to the Summer School General Information handout (blue).

ENRICHMENT COURSES - for Incoming 9 - 12 grades (\$275.00 per class)

The following courses are offered to students who desire to take summer courses to earn enrichment/graduation credits.

***ART I** - Students will explore various media while learning fundamental techniques of design, composition, form and color. Students earn 5 visual and performing arts credits. **UC/CSU approved.**

***ART II** - Students build on techniques already developed and experiment with additional mediums such as; calligraphy, graphic art, glass etching, stencil making and airbrushing. Students earn 5 visual and performing arts credits. **UC/CSU approved.**

DIGITAL IMAGE EDITING (PHOTOSHOP) – This course will teach students about the different types of digital images and how to edit pixel-based images using Adobe Photoshop. Students will learn how to improve digital photographs by adjusting brightness, contrast, color, saturation and other digital image properties as well as how to work with layers, masks, effects, filters, paths, and channels. In addition, students will be taught how to compose original digital artwork in Photoshop and will be introduced to alternative image editing programs. Students earn 5 visual and performing arts credits.

GENERAL INFORMATION

DATES

Summer School will be in session from June 17 until July 19. June 17 is a full day of summer classes beginning at 8:00 am with a brief orientation in the auditorium followed by classes ending at 12:40 pm. Each day period 1 will begin at 8:00 a.m. and end at 10:10 a.m. Period 2 will begin at 10:30 and ends at 12:40. All courses are five weeks.

COST

Tuition is \$250.00 per Incoming Freshmen course and \$275.00 per 9-12 Review and Enrichment course. Students will use their own textbooks for review courses. Textbooks will be loaned for enrichment courses.

REGISTRATION

The application form is due by Friday, June 14, 2019. Tuition must accompany the application. Late registration will be accepted on space available basis until June 17.

RULES AND PROCEDURES

ATTENDANCE

*To ensure credit for summer school, daily attendance is essential. **Exceeding two absences will constitute “no credit” for the course.** Family vacations are not sufficient reason for absence. If a student is absent, a parent or guardian must phone the attendance office (310-547-1138), to verify the absence. A written excuse is to be brought to the attendance office prior to returning to class. A written excuse is also necessary for any release other than illness.

*Three tardies or early releases equal one absence. No “excused tardies” are issued during the summer session.

*Students must be present on July 19 for the final exam. **No early or make-up exams will be given.** A student not present on that day will receive a grade of 0 for the exam.

*Students must return all loaned books to the school on July 19.

*Reports cards will be mailed home on Monday, July 22.

DISCIPLINE

Rules of discipline as stated in the Mary Star Parent/Student Handbook will be enforced in summer school. Students who do not abide by these rules will be asked to withdraw from summer school.

DRESS CODE

The Mary Star of the Sea High School dress code, found on pages 50 - 51 in the Student/Parent Handbook will be enforced in summer school. The S/P Handbook may be found on-line through the school's website. All uniform items must be purchased at **NORMAN'S 371 W. 6th St., San Pedro, (310) 832-8342.**

1. Uniform skirts are available in plaid. Skirts must be hemmed no higher than **TWO INCHES ABOVE THE KNEE.**
2. Uniform shirts/blouses are available in four colors: white, gray, powder blue and navy blue. **Shirts/blouses must be tucked in at all times.**
3. Uniform pants are available in three colors: navy blue, gray, or tan. **OVERSIZED SHIRTS AND BAGGY PANTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.** Boys must wear a plain, dark colored belt.
4. Uniform shorts are available in three colors: navy blue, gray or tan. Shorts must be hemmed above the knee but no higher than **two inches above the knee.**
5. Shoes and socks must be worn on campus. Shoes will have a closed toe and heel and look appropriate with the uniform. Steel-toe boots are not permitted.
6. Girls' earrings may not be larger than a quarter. Boys may not wear earrings.
7. No hats/caps may be worn during the school day.
8. Boy's hair length will be above the collar in the back and may not cover the ear. Close crew cuts (less than 1/4 inch) and shaved heads are not permitted. Faces must be clean shaven. Hairstyles will be moderate: **STUDENTS WHO VIOLATE THE HAIR CODE WILL BE SUSPENDED FROM SCHOOL UNTIL THE VIOLATION HAS BEEN CORRECTED.**

Students who do not dress according to the Mary Star of the Sea dress code will be sent home and considered absent for the day. The Dean of Discipline reserves the right to make all decisions concerning dress code and grooming violations.

PROGRESS/GRADE REPORTS

Progress reports will be sent home via the students on June 28 and July 12. Final report cards will be mailed home on Monday, July 22.

The Main Office (310-547-1138) will be open daily from 7:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. during Summer School. School library hours are 7:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

The first full day of summer school is June 17, beginning with orientation at 8:00 am in the gymnasium. Classes will immediately follow orientation. All students attending summer school must be present and in uniform on June 17.
