ACADEMIC PROGRAM:

The curriculum is college preparatory with both required and elective courses in most subject areas. Twenty-four credits are required to graduate.

Students must successfully complete four years of English and Theology, three years of Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies, one half year of Health, Physical Education, Computer Applications and Related Arts.

AP English Literature, AP English Language, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Chemistry, AP Spanish, AP Government and Politics, AP Biology, and AP Physics are available. Honors courses are offered in English, Languages, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
