The spirit of wisdom, as we discover in today's first reading, comes to those who pray for her. Wisdom, like the word of God, carries a message of consolation as well as of great challenge. The Letter to the Hebrews tells us that the word of God, infused with the wisdom of God, is "sharper than any two-edged sword." We cannot shrink from the wisdom of God, or from the word that has the power to penetrate our hearts and minds. Jesus, the living word of God, the embodiment of wisdom, has strong, deeply penetrating words for the rich young man who comes to him seeking answers to his most profound questions. Just when the young man thought he had done enough to fulfill God's commands, more was asked of him. This is no less true for us.

SELL WHAT YOU HAVE



Perhaps no Gospel creates more questioning in this time period than the one we have today. At the same time, perhaps no Gospel is more relevant to today's society than this one, in which Jesus tells the young man that to truly deserve heaven, he should sell everything he has and give it to the poor.

We are living in a wealthy period of time and in a wealthy area of the country. As many of us are aware, it is getting harder and harder for people to afford housing. People not employed by the high tech firms or having a job with median income are often forced to move seventy or eighty miles away and commute. Yet, by the standards of much of the rest of the nation, they are wealthy people.

A house in San Francisco sells for twice as much as that same house in Sacramento and five times as much as an equivalent house in Indiana. The Bay Area is one of the wealthiest areas of the country and a wonderful place to live, yet there is constant fear that we may lose our jobs or that our rent will increase beyond our means

Meanwhile, things are even worse in other parts of the country. At one time, the Midwest was thriving with manufacturing plants and companies that cared for their employees. Those companies have been replaced by corporations which are more concerned with profit than with the welfare of their employees. Jobs which were once plentiful have been sent to other nations where the labor is cheaper.

In addition, with the increase in robotics, humans are being replaced by machines, meaning that even more people are out of work. The anger and fear of those workers led to a political storm and the election of Donald Trump because he was the only one promising to address the problems. Instead, he has cut the taxes for the wealthy, of whom he is one.

In other words, the wealth of the few is leading more and more to the poverty of the many. Many of the wealthy always want more. Their measure of success is their wealth, so they live in fear of having less. This is the same situation which Jesus was addressing two thousand years ago. The young man is a good person who is following the commandments and living a good life. However, when faced with what Jesus is asking, he walks away because he cannot give up his wealth.

Needless to say we are no different. We do not see ourselves as being able to give up whatever we have for the sake of others. So how do we react to Jesus' request? Is it necessary for us to live in poverty in order to attain heaven? Why did Jesus ask such a thing?

The answer is found in the actions of Jesus' disciples and the people of the early church. They did not sell everything they had and give it to the poor, but they shared what they had and tried to help the poor. They built communities of sharing, and the religion grew as a result. That is what the church of Jesus was all about, caring for each other. In this time of severe questioning of the present day church, that is a thought worth keeping. ~DN

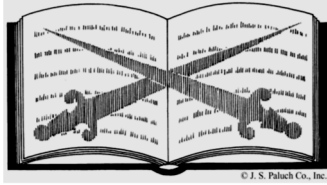

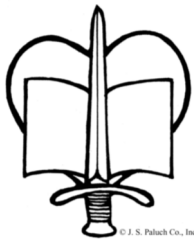
