**COMMUNITY AND SCHOOL:**

Kalaheo High School, originally established in 1966 and located in the city of Kailua, Hawaii, is a comprehensive public high school serving grades nine to twelve. The school is one of four high schools in Windward District of Oahu. The attendance area encompasses the land stretching along the Kailua coastline from Lanikai to Kailua proper, Kalaheo Hillside, Aikahi and Kaneohe Bay Drive to Nanamoana Street.

Homes in the area range from low-rise apartments to luxury custom built single family dwellings. According to the 2010 US Census Bureau, the median household income is \$79,267, somewhat higher than the general population in the State of Hawaii. Educational backgrounds are also somewhat higher than those of the general population. Approximately 26% of the students are military dependents with the majority living on Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay.

Ethnicity distribution within the high school generally matches the local Kailua population. Caucasian (47%) and part-Hawaiian (19%) populations comprise the largest groupings on campus in School Year 2015-2016. Approximately 24 percent of the student body receives free or reduced-cost lunch, 10 percent are identified Special Education and less than one percent are English Language Learners.
