We are pleased that you are considering submitting an essay (high school or middle), a poem (middle or elementary) or artwork (elementary only) for the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Scholarship.

This packet includes the application entry form and guidelines for your submission. Please read it carefully and fill out the necessary information before you submit it with your entry. All entries become the property of UTLA/AAEC. We are looking forward to your participation this year.

Essays: Must be an original work of the topics listed below. Please type four pages, double spaced. It must focus on one or more of the topics listed below.

All entries must be typewritten, (12 pt. font is mandatory) and be accompanied by an entry form.

Poems: Must be of original work of the topics listed below. Even though length will be considered in the contest, length and style will vary according to your own artistic form.

All entries must be typewritten, (12 pt. font is mandatory) and be accompanied by an entry form.

Art Work: Elementary grades K-5 only. Must be of original drawings, but may be inspired from other artwork. It must be no larger than 11 ½" by 14" and no smaller than 8 1/2" by 11". Other artwork in non-conventional (three dimensions) form are welcomed.

All entries must be accompanied by an entry form.

Suggested Topics:

1. How did Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s life experiences contribute to improve the lives of people (especially African-Americans) educationally and economically?
2. Interview at least two people who were active during the lifetime of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Explain how their lives have been affected to see, "The Dream Redeemed" through former President Barack Obama.
3. Complete 8 hours of a community service activity and explain how it may have influenced you or reminded you of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.
