APPLICATION AND ACCEPTANCE PROCEDURES

Application to the International Program at Escondido Adventist Academy (EAA) is available through the school's website at www.easchool.org under Admissions. A list of required documents is posted under Instructions & Resources at the beginning of the online application process. EAA will review applications and assess students' eligibility as soon as all required documentation and the \$350 non-refundable application fee have been submitted online.

TUITION

Tuition is charged per semester and is non-refundable. Initial registration at EAA requires that students pay the semester tuition and incidental deposit in advance in order to enroll and be issued an I-20. Tuition and incidental deposit for subsequent semesters will be due on December 1 for spring classes and May 1 for fall classes. Any unused portion of the deposit will be refunded after graduation or when the student leaves the international program.

HOME STAY

Students applying for grades 7-12 will be permitted to live with a host/guardian. Students applying for grades TK-6 will be required to have a parent with them while in the US.

Lunches are provided Monday – Friday. A portion of the deposit will be applied to a cafeteria account for lunches.
