

# District 4 kindergarten registration continues

The final registration event for Addison School District 4's 2018-19 Kindergarten Registration will be held at Army Trail School, 346 Army Trail Blvd., on Wednesday, April 4 from 4-7 p.m. This is the time to register children who will be five years old on or before September 1, 2018.

Parents are encouraged to pick up a registration packet in advance so they will have time to gather all necessary documents and complete the required paperwork before coming to register their child. Registration packets are available at the District Office, 222 N. Kennedy Drive (Door 18), at each of the school offices, and on the District website at [asd4.org](http://asd4.org). Parents must register in person.

All kindergarten classes in ASD4 are full-day classes.

## **About dual-language students**

Students whose primary language is not English will be screened when they come to register in order to determine class placement.

A two-way dual language program will be available to students in the Stone and Wesley School attendance areas. This program is for children whose primary language is English

and who want dual-language instruction (English and Spanish) through fifth grade and for Stone and Wesley attendance area children whose primary language is Spanish. All students interested in the two-way dual language program will have the ability to sign up for the program at registration.

## **Kindergarten University coming April 11**

All future Kindergarten parents should also mark their calendars for ASD4's Kindergarten University on April 11 from 6-8 p.m. Kindergarten University is designed to show parents what skills their child should have before school begins in August. The event will feature a presentation on Kindergarten Readiness skills along with fun, easy educational ideas families can use to make sure their child is Kindergarten ready.

## **Pre-K camp coming in June**

Additionally, for the first time, District 4 will be holding a 3-week kindergarten camp in June. Parents are encouraged to sign their children up for the program which is designed to help prepare the incoming kindergartners for school.
