

# Study Guide for Freshman English Periods 5 & 8

## Midterm Exam – Mrs. Kennedy

The test will take approximately one hour and will consist of all of the usual parts of an in class test – fill in the blank, multiple choice, matching, true and false, label the vocabulary, compare and contrast, and essay.

What will be different will be an answer sheet. All answers are to be written on the answer sheet, not on the test packet. You may write in the test packet to cross off choices, etc., but your answers will not count if written in the test packet, only on the answer sheet.

The test will cover To Kill A Mockingbird, “The Most Dangerous Game,” “The Cask of Amontillado,” and “The Lottery.” And, because we have spent so much time learning it – lots of vocabulary.

1. Review and study all of the character sheets, study guide questions, vocabulary sheets, writing assignments as well as the copies of the stories themselves. Pay special attention to any parts that were underlined, highlighted or marked as notable in any way.
2. Also, review and study the homework, quizzes and tests that Mrs. Kennedy kept and recently returned to you in English class. Since we corrected all of the quizzes and tests in class you should have all the answers to use to study.
3. We have spent a lot of time on vocabulary from the book and stories this 1<sup>st</sup> semester. The selected words are on your vocabulary sheets, as well as posted on Quizlet, so there are many ways to practice the words there.
4. Be sure you know and understand the meaning of *foreshadowing*, *irony*, *allusion*, *symbolism* and *satire*. Recall examples from the book and stories where these literary terms were an important part of what happened.
