CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:34 p.m., by Board President M. Janet Chin.

The Board presented a certificate of recognition to Mike Supple of Sodexo, Inc., as the District's Unsung Hero for his outstanding service to the District's Food Services Program.

COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS FROM THE BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Sandra Johnson reported that due to the number of teachers interested in the retirement incentive, the District will be able to reinstate a large number of elementary teachers. For intermediate teachers, the declining enrollment is a factor that is being considered in this effort.

Dr. Johnson spoke of the promotion ceremonies taking place tomorrow at Garvey and Temple Intermediate Schools. Promotion ceremonies for the elementary schools will be on Monday, June 20, 2011.

Bob Bruesch talked about the upcoming Health and Safety Fair on September 17, 2011, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., at Duff School to promote student health and health activities for children. Many community partners are helping to plan this event.

Janet Chin indicated that last week she attended a five day conference sponsored by CSBA's Young Elected Officials with speakers such as Arne Duncan, Secretary of Education, David Huff, Senior Advisor to President Obama, and David Cohen, Vice-President of Comcast. Ms. Chin talked about a program being launched by Comcast, Internet Essentials, and providing affordable internet service to families enrolled in the free-lunch program to help boost the technology in school communities around the country. Bob Bruesch indicated that he is looking forward for this year's parent technology academy.

Henry Lo commented that he attended the recent GEA retirement dinner, and he congratulated the many men and women who have spent their time and energy in the education of our students.

Mr. Lo talked about a possible business proposal, to raise revenue, which offers some socially responsible signs and banners with messages within school grounds. Mr. Lo indicated that he has been appointed to a Western Regional Advisory Committee at the U.S. Department of Education to provide input on a needs assessment in education. Mr. Lo is the only school board member from California. The Western Region covers California, Arizona, Nevada, and Utah.

REPORT FROM UNION REPRESENTATIVES

- **Garvey Education Association (GEA)**

Michael Drange, president of GEA, stated that they were pleased that the RIF's (Reduction in Force) for six teachers were rescinded. He commented on GEA's retirement dinner and thanked the Board Members that were present and spoke in appreciation of the teachers retiring who have dedicated their lives to our students.

of open communication, and asked that perhaps Board Members can sit down with different groups to seek the truth in some of the rumors. Mr. Drange is hoping that the District will move forward with the administrative decisions that have to be made.

- **California School Employees Association (CSEA)**

Vicky Walker, president of CSEA, Chapter 292, spoke of similar concerns echoed by Mr. Drange. She talked about the last CSEA chapter meeting for the school year and the farewell given to the 50 CSEA members being laid off. Ms. Walker indicated that some members rescinded their retirement application since the minimum qualifications were not met for the retirement incentive. Ms. Walker expressed her concerns about the delay in labor negotiations and lack of time to evaluate the effects of the layoffs.

REPORT FROM HEAD START REPRESENTATIVE

Becky Lam talked about a meeting she had this morning at the L.A. County Office of Education where the District was recognized as one of the agencies in L.A. County for achievement and excellence. Mr. Lam delivered a plaque to Tony Ramos as liaison to the Head Start Policy Committee.

HEARING OF PERSONS IN THE AUDIENCE

James W. Cox III addressed the Board regarding layoffs and budget assessment from the previous meeting. He restated some of the comments made by Michael Coughlin regarding the budget presentation held on May 26, 2011, and asked whether the reserve is being held from year to year, thus setting aside 11.5 percent, as opposed to the 3 percent reserve required, which he can be used to rescind the layoffs. Mr. Cox talked about layoffs and management recruitment and role of the Board in these decisions.

Brianne Parsons addressed the Board regarding concerns that the District is losing collaboration as a Garvey family when things are not being discussed with CSEA, and some members are suffering from fatigue. Ms. Parsons asked the Board to help CSEA get on the road to negotiations.

Charles L. Howell addressed the Board regarding his Reduction in Force letter, and how he is being asked to retire under duress. Mr. Howell asked Board members for their continued support to having art classes in the District. He compared the decisions being made in the District as a form of pragmatism that may not work in the business of education. Mr. Howell gave an example of how some programs such as school site councils may become disenfranchised and everyone in the school site seems to be second guessing. Mr. Howell thanked the District for his opportunity to become a better teacher; he encouraged everyone to find compassion and work together, and wished everyone a great success.

Cecilia Losoya addressed the Board regarding layoffs and how everyone seemed tired and depressed. She indicated that she is also receiving phone calls asking to find out about decisions in the District. Ms. Losoya expressed her disappointment with the lack of support from some Board members. She spoke of management salaries along with some employees doing multiple jobs, and she questioned whether the District is generating savings with the layoffs. Ms. Losoya offered to help bring light into some of these difficulties addressed tonight.

The Board gave consensus to proceed to Reports and Information Items.

- A. Report by Sodexo on the District’s Food Service program. 17

Mike Supple, Sodexo, Inc., made a presentation regarding the District’s Food Services Program. Mr. Supple addressed the new USDA nutritional requirements for school meals

and planning menus that the District uses for reimbursement purposes. Mr. Supple indicated that Sodexo has a staff of dieticians and registered chefs that work together to design menus that can be offered to students. He described the Sodexo Website and the different tools on wellness, food menus, and nutrition calculators that parents and students can visit to learn about their pursuit of wellness.

Mr. Supple explained that within the last two weeks the food pyramid guide has been replaced switching some nutritional components in quality and quantity of different types of meal planning. Sodexo's services center around the pillars of attractive wellness centers, sending menus home that include some recipes, and supporting activities such as vegetable gardens at the schools as part of the school curriculum.

Mr. Supple spoke of a program, Breakfast in the Classroom, which began last month at Temple Intermediate and Hillcrest Elementary Schools. This program helped to increase the numbers of students having breakfast. He talked about the goals for next year, including forming of a Food Services Advisory Committee and inviting feedback and input from parents and staff on ideas about introducing new products. Mr. Supple explained the efforts to continue sponsoring and promoting school gardens to keep in line with the Board's goal of green energy conservation activities, such as eliminating Styrofoam.

Mr. Supple stated that the summer feeding program at 4 school sites will take place from June 27 through August 4, 2011 and anybody in the community is welcome to join the program. Sodexo staff will be busy preparing for the school opening in the fall and making the school environment a safe place.

Mr. Supple indicated that the Garvey School District has been recognized by the Clinton Foundation and the American Heart Association for its a-la-carte menus being served and items being sold, eliminating sodas, chips, and candy, and promoting the healthy snacks.

Mr. Supple introduced his replacement. Mr. Supple will be leaving the District in a few weeks.

On a question from Bob Bruesch regarding the number of student meals provided, Mr. Supple indicated that there were approximately 1.4 million meals provided throughout the year, not counting the after school and Head Start meals. There were comments sent in from students and teachers about the food services being provided by Sodexo. In the month of February sections of the cafeterias were painted to make a welcoming environment, and there were people visiting from other school districts to observe our District's Food Services Program. Mr. Bruesch stated he heard comments from Noon Duty Aides on how less food is being thrown away. He commended the Food Services Staff for their cooperation with Sodexo staff in the transitioning period.

On a comment from Janet Chin regarding data collection and implementation of food items and programs, Mr. Supple is hoping to increase parent participation by publishing menus and attending school nights and community events, as well as, encouraging parents to visit the Food Services Website and participating in the advisory committee.

Dr. Johnson commented on the benefits of having breakfast in the classroom that reduce tardiness/truancy and improve the behavior of students.

- B.** Becky Wetzel, Consultant to STAR (Alternative Governance) Team, made a presentation on the STAR team meetings and activities throughout the year. The team consisted of Ms. Wetzel, Dr. Sandra Johnson, Genaro Alarcon, Barbara Razo, Bonnie Boman, Martin Garcia, Rosa Marquez, and another two individuals from LACOE, one of

them who recently passed. The team met every month to discuss some of the challenges that the District is facing regarding the program improvement status as part of the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act.

Ms. Wetzel talked about the sequence of a Program Improvement school, from early warning of two years, to Program Improvement Year 1, 2, and beyond. She talked about the restructuring of the school's governance structure by an LEA (Local Education Agency) that makes fundamental reforms in the school's staffing and governance that will improve student academic achievement in the school, as well as having a substantial promise for improvement consistent with state law required by NCLB accountability for Program Improvement Year 4+ schools. The STAR team is the alternative Governance for Garvey Intermediate School which is in Program Improvement Year 5. Under NCLB, the District is required to provide direction for alternative governance for monitoring the instructional program and student achievement. Typically, the STAR Team is to support the school's restructuring plan but Garvey did not develop one.

Ms. Wetzel described the process of the STAR Team and recommendations/commendations given to school staff from February to April 2011. She talked about the challenges for the staff and the team. Ms. Wetzel described the next steps of the STAR Team that will begin in the fall. She defined what an effective school is and listed the common characteristics of a 90/90/90 (achievement, quantity, and quality) School. Ms. Wetzel spoke of goals and progress reports that are necessary for Garvey Intermediate School to undergo the process of "turn around" which could include changing a majority of the staff, changing the structure of the school, and imposing even greater district oversight.

Ms. Wetzel clarified the process of accountability that schools need to measure progress for continuous improvement for all students from year to year, and the negative fiscal impact on districts that have been identified as program improvement for three years or more, at which time a corrective action needs to be written with specific steps on how a District will be doing things different. Ms. Wetzel stated that after Year 4 of program improvement, the District is required to implement a restructuring plan with decisions being made that would impact the established corrective action plan.

Ms. Wetzel spoke of several options that the schools on program improvement have, including reopening as a charter school, closing the school and giving it to a charitable organization, replacing all or most school staff or choose an alternative governance board which was the case for Garvey Intermediate School. Ms. Wetzel spoke of restructuring as making fundamental reforms in such things as staffing and governance to improve academic achievement on schools; however, this does not mean that the alternative governance takes precedence; rather that the School Board of Education assigns the alternative governance board to address these matters. There must be substantial promise to improve student academic achievement with the kinds of actions to monitor progress in the new structure.

Ms. Wetzel talked about this year's challenges for the STAR team to focus on some of the team's goals as there appeared to be no corrective action in place by the school staff that would allow the STAR Team to monitor student progress. The team met monthly with the staff, visited classrooms, and did a walkthrough to have some baseline information in lieu of the missing corrective action plan. Ms. Wetzel stated that the team needed to do a better job in communicating and intensive professional staff development was needed to ensure that teachers were using different strategies to engage student learning. This led to some frustrations and concerns that were addressed with principals and recommendations for the future. Ms. Wetzel stressed that the team was not to make decisions for the teachers, rather it was to monitor progress aligned with standards and objectives and observe what is called "student talk."

Ms. Wetzel talked about the importance of having a plan that creates stability and a focus on creating change, moving the school forward and helping those students who are not achieving. School staff needs to be clear on the purpose of the team and have a process of collaboration and understanding on what things need to be done differently that will focus on teaching and/or student learning.

Ms. Wetzel addressed the challenges found regarding the level of instruction for different groups of students and some inequities created by the school's master schedule. She talked about the next steps related to developing a restructured achievement plan in a collaborative mode, plans to have frequent meetings with teachers and Board meeting presentations, efforts to improve communications, and the continued monitoring of areas in need of improvement with morning and afternoon classroom visitations that will lead to having an effective school that can measure student achievement and demonstrate quality and equity, as defined by a famous researcher, Doug Reeves, with common characteristics of 90/90/90 schools. Ms. Wetzel added that new legislation will continue to focus on progress in school structure and efforts in turning around school achievement around the country.

Ms. Wetzel answered several questions from Board members. Mr. Lo asked questions related to the number of middle schools in the county that are currently on program improvement status and the most common structures that PI schools are choosing, Ms. Chin asked Ms. Wetzel's perspective on the staff's understanding of the Team's monitoring process, and whether more staff development is needed to address strategies in meeting the needs of a diverse community.

Mr. Ramos commended Ms. Wetzel for the presentation and commented on the challenges in today's environment for teachers and students. Mr. Bruesch commented on the great tools of RTI (Response to Intervention) and PLCs (Professional Learning Centers) that can be used to enhance this restructuring process. Mr. Yuen stressed the need to improve communications and build a structure of high achievement and direction for all stakeholders. Ms. Wetzel spoke of the need for teachers to have a clear vision that they support and feel accountable. Ms. Chin asked how data was being collected. Ms. Wetzel indicated that from classroom observations, the team gathered data and looked for trends to draw the recommendations. Initially, data was quantitative on the alignment of standards and objectives and criteria established to measure the learning expectations.

Dr. Johnson added that conversations took place with principals to discuss the classroom observation and give feedback but the staff did not realize that it was the principal's role to give individual feedback to the teachers. Ms. Wetzel indicated that the staff involved were to come up with recommendation; however, in the beginning the STAR team did not have a concise plan for evaluation. She is hopeful that staff will be developing a plan and that the team can have better planning to monitor progress on grounded research.

Bob Bruesch moved, Tony Ramos seconded, and the motion carried by a vote of 5 to 0, to suspend the Board Bylaws and extend the meeting to 11:30 p.m.

Bob Bruesch asked about the master schedule. Ms. Wetzel noted the importance of not changing the master schedule in the middle of the school year and that major reforms in the future will seek to have the master schedule that effectively meets the needs of the students. It will be the teams' job to provide teachers with new options that they can adopt themselves. Ms. Chin stated that she looks forward to having continuous reports to the Board from the STAR Team. The Board asked that they not wait until December but get reports every two months.

On a question from Bob Bruesch, Dr. Johnson stated that parents and teachers do not provide input in principal evaluations. John Yuen recommended that the Superintendent take into account the feedback provided for principal evaluations.

On the motion of Henry Lo, seconded by Tony Ramos and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board waived the District's policy regarding disclosure of the student's name in public for Item B.

- B. On the motion of John Yuen, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, 19
the Board approved the recommendation to expel student 10-11-15, an 8th grader at Garvey Intermediate School for violation of the following Education Codes:
48900(i): Committed an obscene act or engaged in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
48900(k): Disrupted school activities or otherwise willfully defied the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, school officials, or other school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties.

On the motion of Tony Ramos seconded by Bob Bruesch, and carried by a vote of 4-1-0 (John Yuen Opposed), the Board approved the recommendation to suspend the expulsion. Evidence must be provided of meeting the rehabilitation plan.

- C. On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Janet Chin, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board approved the recommendation to adopt Resolution No. 10-11-24 Directive to notify classified employees of the implementation of layoff. 20

On a question from Bob Bruesch, Dr. Johnson stated that this recommendation was approved by the Head Start Policy Committee.

FUTURE MEETINGS

Henry Lo asked to find out what Scholastics is offering as school partner to help raise revenue. Bob Bruesch asked that the Board re-visit Proposition Q and the specific rules on the ballot measure that requires an oversight committee to review. He reminded the Board of the recent change on the priorities and the need to have the Bond Oversight Committee meeting regularly. Janet Chin asked for a report on the construction activities happening through this summer. 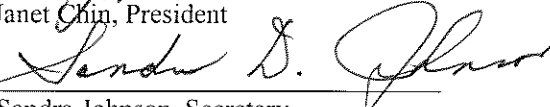
