# 3. Approval of Agenda and Minutes:

- a. The following items were added to the agenda: Voting on the 3 year Academic Plan.
- b. Minutes of 4/11/18 were accepted as corrected: 4.f.iv.: Some students were missed for Academic awards and they felt badly.

### 4. Reports and Concerns:

### a. Admin:

- i. Graduation is on track for 419 students with 11 Valedictorians. It will be on the field with reserved seating on the field and public seating in the bleachers. The special guests will be hosted in the library this year due to SP getting ready to move out by June 1st due to construction. No balloons, signs or umbrellas allowed in the stadium complex until after the ceremony.
- ii. Busy hiring for 20 positions. Teachers moving to mainland, going to law school, etc. Only two transferred to town
- iii. Ho'lke was a success with many people attending. We were thoroughly impressed with the students' presentations about their learning. We will have a 9th grade Open House in August and a 10th-12th Ho'ike each May.
- iv. SCC Elections: There were no responses to the form published in the 4/5/18 parent bulletin asking for nominations by 4/20/18 for the Parent/Community representative. Teacher & Classified nominations are being taken until 5/27 and elections will be on 5/31.
- v. WASC 6 yrs accreditation with a recommendation to work on rigor and we also gained Wai'anae complex accreditation, one of the first in the nation.

#### b. Parents:

- i. Saturday Band Concert was good, but the cafeteria is in need of significant improvement. We need to help the band teacher because at least 10 parents signed up to be on the booster but no response from him.
- ii. PTSA will take on the cafe improvement project. First assess and clean then do the long term repair and maintenance. There is a lot to do and it will start this summer.
- iii. PTSA gave 5 scholarships worth \$750 each. Anonymous donors gave 3 students computers and \$2200 each with a backpack.
- iv. PTSA Convention last weekend with the biggest attendance. WHS got an award for increased attendance at our meetings.
- v. Project Grad is on track, 99% complete and ready to go. It is fully financed.

vi. Complaint because of awardees' casual dress at the scholarship night. CCC counselor will address this next year with all awardees.
