



## Parent E-Learning Expectations

We are appreciative of your partnership. During these unprecedented times, we are thankful for your flexibility as we plan to move forward. We aim to provide your student with meaningful, quality Christian education. Our teachers are working diligently to prepare to take our 4th quarter content and present it online until we are able to return to the classroom. This week, we are using calamity days to give our teachers time to prepare these online lessons.

Online Instruction will begin March 23, 2020. You will be receiving communication from your student's teacher(s) via email. We are using Google Classroom for grades 3-12.

This week, March 16-20, we encourage your student to read, create and move. Please refer to our website [www.mcseaglesoh.org](http://www.mcseaglesoh.org) for more websites and resources to keep your student's mind engaged this week. It is important to stay active and engaged. Please spend some time each day reading a good book.

Your child's teacher(s) will be sending assignments through email or Google Classroom for each day. **Unless your child's teacher tells you or your child otherwise, schoolwork is due that same day.**

1. Students will be online to complete assignments. Please decrease other screen time (video games, cell phones, etc.)
2. Structure is important for students. Please make sure your student is eating properly and getting 8-10 hours of sleep per night.
3. Students will be most productive if working at a table or desk, not on the couch or in bed. Distractions, such as the TV, should be off.
4. For the best opportunity for success, your student should follow a schedule, with a block of time dedicated to school. This schedule should be as consistent as possible.
5. It is also recommended that the location for the school block be in a quiet but central location. Students should not be completing schoolwork in isolation (such as a bedroom). Students who are accustomed to a classroom setting complete digital coursework best with some supervision.
6. Students should be encouraged to complete schoolwork in their school block, and not postpone assignments until "later." Stretch breaks should be given!
7. Grades will be affected by late submission.
8. Teachers will be available Monday-Friday between 10am-3pm to respond to emails. Assignments will be given daily so students aren't overwhelmed.
9. Assignments for grades 3-12 will be given via Google Classroom. Other websites and videos may be assigned for your student. Preschool-2nd grade teachers will communicate with you and your student via email.
