

**PUBLIC NOTICE**  
**FROM THE NORTHEAST ORANGE COUNTY SELPA**

**DISABLED CHILDREN MAY RECEIVE ASSISTANCE THROUGH  
THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS**

Parents, if your child is between the ages of birth and 22, including children not enrolled in public school programs, and you think that a mental or physical problem exists that may make it difficult for your child to learn, contact your local school district or Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) for information and assistance. Specialists in education for children with disabilities will assess your child whether he or she is enrolled in public or private schools (including parochial schools) to see if he or she is in need of special education services.

Federal and state laws require public schools to provide free and appropriate education for children with disabilities. Programs are offered in the public schools throughout Orange County for children with special needs between the ages of 3 and 22. Parents of infants and toddlers from birth up to 3 years, who may be experiencing delays or problems, may contact Regional Center of Orange County for free screening and evaluation. If needed, either Regional Center or the public schools will coordinate and provide services.
