The annual gala is sponsored by the Moanalua High School PTSA as its one and only fundraiser. Proceeds of the dinner and silent auction provide supplementary funds for equipment, supplies and campus programs. In 2018, the PTSA was able to provide post-high school scholarships, teacher and staff appreciation gifts, student breakfast on the school's unique ACT Testing day, training for MeneMAC students, sponsorship for the school's excellent May Day assembly (by the Polynesian Dance Club) and travel assistance for the various student clubs and organizations representing Moanalua High School and Hawaii in national competition on the mainland.

Since opening its doors in 1972, Moanalua High School continues to be recognized nationally as one of the most successful public school programs in Hawai'i. Its success is built around a committed group of educators, community leaders, parents, students, and volunteers-at-large, whose energy inspires each generation of students to dream big and reach high in the spirit of kina'ole.

About the Menehune Kina'ole Award

Hawaiian lore attributes many great deeds to the legendary menehune, including the building of fishponds, roads, temples and other magnificent structures over the course of a single, miraculous moonlit night. From its first graduating class in 1975, Moanalua High School, like its nickname, has built an impressive tradition of excellence and service to the community in a short period of time.

To celebrate the accomplishments of its graduates, and to express its gratitude to community supporters and friends, Moanalua High School established the "Menehune Kina'ole Award". The concept of Kina'ole is best described as "flawlessness" and this award honors one who has done the right thing, at the right time, for the right reason – the first time.



The Honorees

Our 2019 honorees carry on the spirit of Kina'ole as *“the best of the best.”* Their professional accomplishments allow each of them to stand at the top of their fields. Their lifelong commitment to service is indicative of why they are so deserving of the Kina'ole Award. It is our privilege to recognize each of these recipients for perpetuating the spirit of Kina'ole in all that they do.



Julia Toyama has spent most of her professional career at Moanalua High School and she truly embodies the “Menehune Spirit.” Mrs. Toyama began her tenure at Moanalua High School as a Japanese Language teacher in 1981. After thirteen years in the classroom, she became the Student Activities Coordinator at MoHS. Julia then spent a few years as a District Resource Teacher for Asian and Pacific Languages for the Central District. Missing the opportunity to work with students, she returned to Moanalua High School and began pursuing a degree in counseling, which she completed in 1995. She served as a counselor for ten years and eventually became an administrator in 2005. She was a vice-principal until her retirement in 2013.

In her varied roles at the school, Julia has always put students at the forefront. Her love for Moanalua High School and its students is genuine and unwavering. The school appreciates her many years of hard work and dedication.



Dean Sakamoto is a 1979 graduate of Moanalua High School. Dean earned Bachelor of Architecture from the University of Oregon. He continued his education with a Master of Architecture from the Cranbrook Academy of Art and Masters of Environmental Design from Yale. His Hawaii and Connecticut-based firm, Dean Sakamoto Architects LLC, is known for its environmentally sensitive and culturally specific designs. Dean has also served as a fulltime faculty member at the Yale School of Architecture and Residential Fellow at Morse College and Silliman College.

In 2014 he was appointed by Governor Neil Abercrombie to serve on the Board of Commissioners of the Hawaii State Foundation on Culture and the Arts. Today, he is the founder and director of SHADE, a collaborative design practice and non-profit professional training and community service institute.



Leighton Hirai graduated from the University of Hawaii at Manoa in 1969 with a degree in Microbiology. He soon found his way to teaching at Leilehua High School in 1972 and then Moanalua High School in 1976. At MoHS he helped build the foundation for a strong science program teaching chemistry and biology. He was also actively involved with his students including but not limited to advisor for the 1980 and 1984 graduating classes. He cherished those opportunities to interact with and mentor his students and helped foster a strong sense of community.

Leighton's career after MoHS saw him as an Educational Officer and Personnel Specialist for the Department of Education until his retirement in 2009. He currently spends his time with family and participating in the different ministries of his church
