

EARLY GRADUATION

All recommendations for early graduation shall be made to the Board of Education on an individual basis.

The Board may grant requests for early graduation upon application from students and parents.

The intent of the application procedure for early graduation is to examine the student's background and academic record to provide advice and counsel to the student and parents about consequences of early graduation.

Even though a student may be permitted to graduate early, he/she still must have met all state requirements and he/she must have earned 240 units of credits as specified in Board Policy.
