Class of 2019

Seniors: College entrance exams should be completed no later than December 2018. Some colleges may only take the October or November tests. Make sure you check with each individual campus. The SAT and ACT registration is online. Pay very close attention to the registration deadlines for each test. **Prospect High School is a SAT test center. The PHS test center code number is 05710. The PHS school code number is 053344.**

Seniors: **Part of the registration process is for students to request scores to be sent by College Board (SAT) or ACT to your specific colleges. Colleges want official scores from Collegeboard (SAT) or ACT.**

College Applications: Students interested in applying to UC or CSU schools will do so

online. The deadline for both UC and CSU systems is November 30th.

The filing period for the UC campuses is the month of November. The filing period for UC campuses is November 1st – November 30th. To apply for UC campuses go online to: www.universityofcalifornia.edu/admissions/. The filing period for CSU campuses is October 1st – November 30th.

For CSU campuses, go to <https://www2.calstate.edu/apply>. Students can start filling out the High School Planner on the California Colleges website at <https://www.californiacolleges.edu/#/user-login>, for CSU campuses. The California Colleges website will allow students to transfer the information entered directly onto the CSU applications starting October 1st.

Financial Aid – 2019-2020 FAFSA

The 2019-2020 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application period will open on **October 1, 2018**. Second, the FAFSA will be completed using prior-prior year (PPY) tax data. **Deadline: March 2, 2019**

Class of 2020 & 2021

Sophomores and Juniors: **PSAT/NMSQT** stands for the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test and National Merit Scholarship Qualifying test. **The PSAT will be administered to SOPHOMORES and JUNIORS on Wednesday, October 10th.** The PSAT offers an opportunity to practice for the SAT test. The PSAT/NMSQT is a great way to preview and practice for the SAT. The PSAT tests the same skills and knowledge as the SAT. When you get your test results, connect your College Board account to get free personalized SAT study recommendations.

Fall Semester Class Visits Schedule

Freshmen Class Visits: Guidance counselors will be visiting with freshmen during the week of September 17th to review graduation requirements, present California higher education information, support services etc.

Senior Class Visits: Guidance counselors will be visiting with seniors during the week of September 11th to review graduation requirements and the college application process. Students will be asked to fill out a “Brag Sheet” on Naviance in which they will provide school & community involvement as well as any awards & honors they have received.

New Class Selection Procedures 2019 - 2020

Juniors Class Visits and 2019-2020 Class Selection: Guidance counselors will visit the current juniors during the week of November 26th to review graduation requirements, the college application process, and post-secondary planning. After classroom presentations are complete, students will each have a one-on-one meeting with their counselor to finalize class selection and prepare for the appropriate post-secondary pathway.

Sophomores Class Visits and 2019-2020 Class Selection: Guidance counselors will visit current sophomores during the week of January 14th to review graduation requirements and work on their 4-year high school plan. After classroom presentations are complete, students will each have a one-on-one meeting with their counselor talk about class selection and explore post-secondary pathways.

Freshmen Class Selection will take place during the week of January 28. On Day 1 of classroom visits, Guidance counselors will present on graduation requirements, 4-year high school planning, and college eligibility. On Day 2 of classroom visits, guidance counselors will have one-on-one meetings with each student will have the opportunity to discuss class selections with a guidance counselor in the classroom. Students will have an opportunity to work on Naviance activities during this time.

Prospect Guidance Counselors will host a Parent Night on the evening of Thursday, September 27th at 6:30pm in Room 30. Guidance Counselors will provide parents with information concerning high school graduation requirements, college entrance requirements, choosing classes and a Q&A session.

Parent and Student Suggestions for Academic Success

- Parents should contact teachers directly by phone or email if they have a question about their student's academic performance.
- Students and parents can log into School Loop to track homework assignments turned in and grades.
- Parents should require their student to bring home textbooks and/or materials, daily handouts and daily assignment sheets.
- Parents should see that their student's homework is complete. Parents should not do the work – just check to make sure it is done.
- Parents should provide a quiet place for their student to do his/her work. The kitchen table is sometimes better than the bedroom, which may contain various electronic distractions. Require your student to do his/her school work at a set time each day.

We have been actively scheduling colleges to visit Prospect over the summer and are pleased to report 32 schools have already made plans to meet with our students (that's 14 more than this time last year!). The College & Career Center is always open and has a dynamic schedule in place for our students sail through the college application season smoothly. We had 11 varying sessions on college applications, types of school options, and majors presented by visiting admissions officers, independent college counselors, and your College & Career Center Specialist.

While the fall is heavily dedicated to college applications and meeting those deadlines, we encourage all types of career exploration throughout the year. If there is a particular field of interest or profession you would like more information on, then we welcome your inquiries and suggestions.

Parents, every Monday from 8-9am there is an open hour dedicated to you to drop in and meet with Ms. Bencomo. No appointment necessary and you are always welcome.

As a reminder, your students will continue to communicate with their Guidance Counselors for anything related to their time at Prospect. Ms. Bencomo's role is to facilitate planning beyond their secondary education. Please take advantage of this service.
