School Responsibilities:

Valdosta Early College Academy will:

- 1. Provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards by:**
 - ❖ Showing respect for the diversity of all students and their families
 - ❖ Demonstrating professional behavior and a positive attitude
 - ❖ Coming to class prepared to provide high quality instruction focused on the Georgia Performance Standards

- ❖ Providing differentiated instruction that meets the needs of all learners
- ❖ Assessing student work and post grades on a consistent basis
- ❖ Sending home a 4-1/2 week Interim progress report and a Report Card each nine week grading period
- ❖ Participating in parent/guardian conferences to create a home-school collaboration
- ❖ Collaborating with other educators (counselors, administrators, etc.) to provide support for students
- ❖ Communicating with parents/guardians about student commendation and recommendations through phone contacts and/or emails

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.

Parents may schedule individual conferences with teachers throughout the school year. During parent conferences, teachers will utilize the School-Parent Compact as a tool to address any issues or concerns of the parents and students.

- ❖ Be aware of what my child is learning, what is expected of each student, and how my student performs on each assignment using the Parent Portal, Interim progress reports, and/or looking through my student's notebooks
- ❖ Sign and return all Interim progress reports and Report Cards
- ❖ Provide a home environment that encourages and supports my child's learning and the development of positive behaviors

Student Responsibilities:

- ❖ Believe that I can learn and I am responsible for my learning
- ❖ Demonstrate respect for myself, for others, and my school
- ❖ Obey the school and bus rules
- ❖ Try to do my best in my academic work and in my behavior
- ❖ Understand that I must maintain a grade point average of 75 or above in all academic classes and pass all electives
- ❖ Come to school with a positive attitude and prepared to learn
- ❖ Work cooperatively with my classmates, teachers and other school staff
- ❖ Communicate with my parents/guardians about what happens each day and upcoming events at school
