## Summer School Programs

Currently Mr. Sonnier is meeting with students who are in need of summer school to recover credit and will send home an invitation letter to parents/students. In addition, a letters and/or a Parent Link will be sent to students who are accepted into the summer school.

The **first session** will begin on Monday, June 4 and end on Friday, June 15, 2018. The **second session** will begin on Monday, June 18th and end on Friday, June 29<sup>th</sup>. Class will start promptly at 7:30 a.m. and ends at 2:00 p.m.

### Summer School Attendance Policy

Daily attendance is required for the student to receive credits necessary for graduation. Students have been enrolled with

priority from 12th, 11th, 10th, and 9th, based on their needs to meet graduation requirements. If a student misses more than 6 hours of school during a session, then he/she will be dropped from the course. There will be **no exceptions** to this policy. As this policy is mandated by the State of California and the Hemet Unified School Board policy, there is absolutely no flexibility for any expected or unexpected reasons including sickness, doctors' appointments, vacations, disciplinary action, etc.

### **Summer School Program Expectations**

All students present on campus are bound to abide by established district-wide expectations regarding dress code, behavior, etc.

**Any time out of class due to an infraction of the discipline policy will count against the 6 hours of allowed absence per session.** It is a privilege to be a part of the Summer Intervention Program and any disruption to the learning process will not be tolerated.

### **Nutrition**

Breakfast and lunch will be provided daily during the nutrition break at no charge. A menu will be provided on the first day of school. Breakfast will begin at 7:10 a.m. and lunch will be served from 11-11:25 a.m.

### **Transportation**

Parents who requested transportation for their student will be contacted by the Transportation Department, if he/she qualifies. To qualify for transportation, a child must reside over 4.5 miles from Hamilton High School. Bus information will be available towards the end of May.

### **Summer Opportunity for Juniors**
