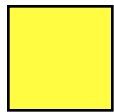

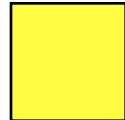

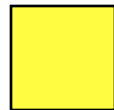

PROJECT DEADLINE/LATE WORK POLICY/SUBMISSION/ACADEMIC DISHONESTY/OBJECTIVES

Any work not submitted by an assigned due date is considered late.

Students will use Turnitin when submitting the assignment for grading. Students will receive specific instructions within the first few days of class regarding specific submission procedures.

Academic dishonesty is not tolerated in AP Language and Composition. Academic Dishonesty includes cheating or copying the work of another student and/or plagiarism. Plagiarism will be verified on Turnitin. The limit will be 15%. Any amount over 15% will be deducted from the student's final score.

Objectives: Students will complete the assignment for the following reasons:

1. To allow the teacher to determine the student's level of writing ability and design instruction to improve any deficiencies.
2. To allow the teacher to assess the student's ability to think critically about a complex text. All directions listed here must be followed exactly for full credit.

Directions for AP Lang Prep Project for The Crucible:

Read *The Crucible* and create a literacy device journal.

- Literary Device (note the type: metaphor, personification, allusion, symbolism)
- Write 2-3 sentences of analysis/ commentary for each entry
- 20 Total Entries - please write 5 entries for each act

Please note that you should have a total of 20 entries in your literary device journal. Entries should represent the book or play as a whole, and should not be restricted to merely one act or one section of the book. The student should demonstrate knowledge of the entire work. Additionally, each entry should contain analysis (not summary) of the quoted passage. The depth of analysis will be evaluated as part of the student's grade. The example below has been included to illustrate both format and depth of commentary.

BOTTOM LINE: PLEASE AVOID SUMMARIZING THE QUOTES!!!

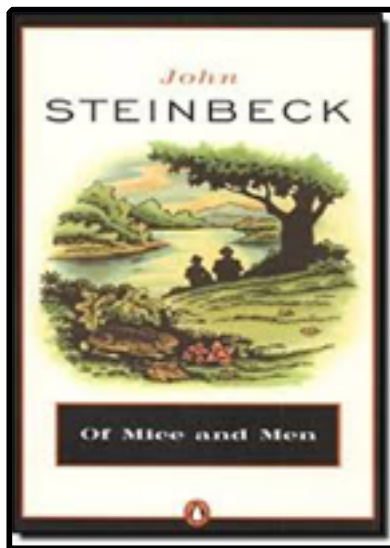
Example of Literary Device Journal

Quote	Literary Device	Analysis/ Commentary
"It's weirdish, I know not—she seems to walk like a dead one since last night" (i.i.290).	Figurative Language/ Symbolism	Mercy utilizes a simile to describe Ruth's trance-like behavior in order to emphasize the severity of Ruth's "sickness." This simile would also be particularly alarming to a Puritan, since "walk[ing] like the dead" conjures images of the supernatural, which is associated with evil and possibly witchcraft.
"Abby, we've got to tell. Witchery's a hangin' error...like they done in Boston two year ago! We must tell the truth, Abby! You'll only be whipped for dancin', and the other things!" (i.i. 316-19).	Conflict	Mary Warren's initial plea to confess about the girls' dancing in the woods is ignored by Abigail and the others. This conflict between the girls sets the stage for the downward spiral which eventually ends in many innocent people accused of witchcraft. Additionally, Abigail's and Mary's disagreement evolves into a much more serious moral dilemma which will determine the fate of the play's hero.
