BookFlix Engages Early Learners



Amanda Sears, a Technology Integration Specialist at Amherst Exempted Village School District, uses INFOhio resources almost daily with students and teachers in grades K-12. “INFOhio digital resources are easily accessible and contain high-quality information aligned to Ohio’s Learning Standards.” Amanda introduces INFOhio resources as early as kindergarten and says, “It is great to teach students how to access fiction and nonfiction resources in one place. With less clutter and distraction, young students stay focused and on task, and our teachers can be assured that the resources are age appropriate.”

In Amherst, the 1st grade recently used INFOhio’s [BookFlix](#) to study hibernation. To generate interest, students first listen to and read the fiction eBook, [Bear Snores On](#), before diving into the paired nonfiction eBook, [Bear Cub Grows Up](#). Through this exercise, students recall facts to support their learning about hibernation. Young students always have fun with the BookFlix Puzzlers, interactive learning games, which make the perfect extension activity. Equally popular with Amherst students and teachers is the “Meet the Creators” section where they learn more about their favorite authors and illustrators.

79,926 Pages Read and Counting!

At Thornville Elementary School, 4th and 5th grade teachers use [Storia](#) from INFOhio with their students. Scholastic's Storia is a collection of 300+ eBooks, hand selected to support Ohio's Learning Standards, with built-in tools to help teachers monitor students' reading and comprehension progress. Kim Thomas, Library Media Specialist, tells us that teachers are taking advantage of progress data Storia provides for each student. Teachers are choosing to assign books to the entire class or individual students and often allow students to choose their own book.

With science titles aligned to curriculum from alligators to zebras and black holes



to volcanoes, each Thornville Elementary 4th and 5th grade classroom gets a whole new library, free to the school, through Storia from INFOhio. Thornville's 4th and 5th grade students have read an amazing total of 79,926 pages from July-December 2018!

Senior Capstones Anchored in Research



Students picked a famous person they wanted to learn about and used INFOhio's [World Book Student](#) and [Kids InfoBits](#) to find biographical information and photographs. Students used their findings to create a visual display using a re-purposed water bottle sculpted into their famous person. The assignment blended research, creativity, collaboration, and composition making this a memorable learning event!
