Referral Process

How can I access these services?

- Parents, school administrators, and school staff may refer the student for services
- Student may self-refer

Do I need to pay for services?

- Services are provided free of charge to all El Rancho Unified School District students
- Students with Medi-Cal may be referred to outside mental health agencies and receive services at the school sites
- Students with private insurance (HMO, PPO, Etc.) may receive case management services to link with providers
- Those who are uncertain if they qualify for services may contact our office

Who provides the services?

- Mental health services are provided by a LCSW/ASW, LMFT/AMFT, MSW Intern, MFT Intern and/or community mental health agency.

ACCESS is the intake process for parent/guardians to connect students with mental health counseling services.
