SchoolGoals

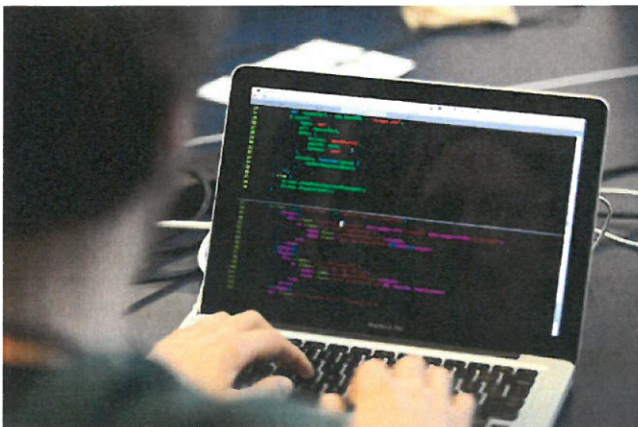
- Our school will increase the percentage of students scoring at level 3 or 4 on the 2019 Math GMAS by 18% of the overall eighth grade population which will thus yield results higher than the current state average of 34.
- 80 percent of students will achieve a Lexile measure equal to or greater than 1090 by the end of 8th grade
- Achieve STEM Certification to support the growing number of employees needed in our area

Area of Emphasis

Math Focus: Understand the concept of a linear equations and use them to describe real world relationships

Reading Focus: Find evidence from literary or informational texts to support analysis, reflection, and research

STEM Focus: Computer coding and energy transfer



- Develop regular formative assessments to ensure that students are mastering content prior to the final test.
- Provide numerous opportunities for students to practice reading, both in class and independently. This will include the ability for students to check out reading material for summer reading.
- Partner with the health community to provide guest speakers, field trip experiences, and information regarding computer coding, energy transfer, and energy use in our community.
- Teach, model, and reinforce middle school procedures and expectations.
- Provide information regarding high school as well as early college entry.

As parents, we will...

- Reinforce math concepts by discussing functions in our daily life (number of helpers vs. time it takes to make dinner, cost of postage as weight increases, amount a car is worth over time).
- Attend the math seminars with my child to learn what is being taught in class.
- Listen to my child read aloud several times each week.
- Check my child's planner each night.
- Download and use the Power School app to stay informed about my child's progress.

As students, we will...

- Complete the homework assignments with my parent and mark the math problems that I do not understand to review with my teachers
- Read every day. I will read a minimum of 2 books at my reading level each nine weeks. I will complete the summer reading assignment.
- Participate in STEM activities so that I can decide if STEM is an area of interest to me.
- Attend school regularly and on time.
- Show respect for myself, my school, and other people.
- Believe that I can and will learn by obeying the school rules.
- Always try to do my best in my work by completing all homework and class work and asking questions when I do not understand.
