For 2011-2012, Reed City High School made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English language arts and mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort. Reed City High School has been actively involved in the North Central Accreditation process, and we are in the fifth year of the evaluation cycle. The program aligns and directs our school improvement for student achievement.

State law requires that we also report additional information in the areas of assigning students, its school improvement plan, its core curriculum, testing instruments, parent teacher conference numbers, and dual enrollment statistics.

We, at RCHS have resident students use our onsite registration process to enroll in school and non resident students are afforded the school of choice program for enrollment. Our school improvement process is guided by our involvement in the North Central Accreditation program. The district core curriculum can be reviewed by logging on to our website [www.reedcity.k12.mi.us](http://www.reedcity.k12.mi.us), and testing results can be found in the attached AER. Information relating to parent/teacher conference numbers, college equivalency courses, and enrollments in AP courses are as follows: We have an average of 33% attendance in our parent/teacher conferences, currently offer two advanced placement courses (British and World Literature) with 42 current enrollees (or 9%) taking these courses, and 2 % qualify for college credit after taking the AP exam.

We at Reed City High School are very pleased and proud of the most recent state assessment results. It is indicative of the hard work and dedication that both the staff and the students put forth on these assessments.
