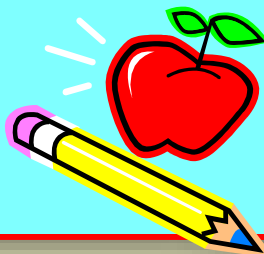

Application Common Mistakes

1. Report your grades as Semesters!
2. On the CSU APPLY all your "A" Courses will be inputted into the fall section. All your "B" Courses will be entered into the spring section, No matter what quarter you took the course in
3. You have to report your Senior Classes on the application as Quarter 1 & 3 are (IP) In progress and Quarter 2 & 4 are reported as Planned (P)
4. Your Classes need to match your transcript. Don't change the name of the titles of the courses. For example, Discrete Mathematics is not Pre-Calculus on your application. ERWC is not AP Language. If your transcript says Principal of Dec. it is not AP Government
5. ERWC is Reported as CSU Expository Reading and Writing
6. TCM is Reported as Transition to College Math and Statistics
7. American Lit. / Cont. Comp. / Econ. and Prin. of Dec. are two different classes and need to be reported as so.
8. On the CSU application you can omit grades that you received an F or and D in, if you made up the class or with a class similar to the course.
9. On the UC and Common application you must report all A-G grades if you failed or passed

Please check out the event calendar on the Poly high website under the college center page. **NAVIANCE** : remember you need to link your Common application to Naviance for counselors and teachers to submit your College application fee waivers, letters of recommendation and transcripts. Extra Graduation Ticket

Remember that to get an extra graduation ticket you must print out and submit a copy of your college application that has been completed and submitted. You will need to fill out and attach a Blue form to your document before it will be submitted and granted for an additional ticket.

The deadline to submit the copy of your college application is **December 2nd, 2018**

Remember you must also submit a printout copy of a completed and submitted FAFSA application or Dream Act application with a Purple attached form by **February 28th**. Or you will no longer be eligible for the extra graduation ticket. You must submit both documents to receive your extra graduation ticket. Pick up the Blue and purple submission form in the college center
