Community:

Kalani High School (KHS) located in Waialae-Kahala, a suburb in East Honolulu, has a population of about 40,000. The median household income of residents is \$102,844. Approximately half of the community has attained college degrees. In the Waialae-Kahala area, KHS is the only high school with five elementary schools (grades K-5) and one middle school (grades 6-8).

School:

Kalani High School is a public high school established in 1958 and is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Enrollment is approximately 1400 students in grades 9-12 and reflects the ethnic variety of the state. Approximately 22% of the students qualify for free/reduced lunch.

Curriculum:

The academic school year consists of a seven period bell schedule, with alternating odd/even period days. An advisory or study hall period is embedded in even period days, allowing students to receive added academic assistance. Organizationally, the year is divided into two semesters of 19-20 weeks. Each semester is divided into two quarters of 8-10 weeks each. All classes meet every other day for 75 minutes. The school year opens in August and closes before June 11.

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered in Biology, Calculus AB/BC, Capstone: Seminar/Research, Chemistry, Computer Science A, English Language/Composition, English Literature/Composition, Macroeconomics, Psychology, and U.S./World History. Currently, there is no official school policy limiting the number of AP courses taken in one year. Students interested in taking AP courses must obtain teacher approval through a signed contract.

Honors classes are offered in Biology (open to incoming freshmen taking Geometry) and Chemistry (open to students who have completed Algebra 1 with a grade of "B" or higher and enrolled in/completed Algebra 2).

The Dual Credit program is a partnership between the Department of Education and the University of Hawaii System, allowing public high school juniors and seniors to attend college classes while earning both high school and college credits.

Online Courses or E-School provides standards-based, online classes for Hawaii students. Students enrolled in any public school can take these supplemental online courses in addition to their regular classes.

- ◆ Academic Honors: 4 credits of Math, 4 credits of Science, 2 credits minimum from AP/Running Start courses
- ◆ Career & Technical Education (CTE) Honors: Completes a specified program of study with a "B" or better, meets/exceeds proficiency on a performance-based assessment
- ◆ STEM Honors: 4 credits of Math, 4 credits of Science, STEM Capstone or STEM Senior Project

*4th math credit must be beyond Algebra 2

*Of the 4 credits in Science, 1 credit must be in Biology and the other 3 credits lab-based sciences.

When calculating cumulative GPAs, semester grades are used for semester courses and year grades for year courses. Cumulative GPAs and class ranks are weighted and computed at the end of each semester. Passing grade is a D.

Class of 2018:

There were 320 graduates in the Class of 2018.

- ◆ 44 earned 4.0 - 4.0+
- ◆ 95 earned 3.5 - 3.99
- ◆ 60 earned 3.0 - 3.49
- ◆ 56 earned 2.50 - 2.99
- ◆ 33 earned 2.0 - 2.49
- ◆ 32 earned less than a 2.0

Class of 2018 Post High School Plans:

- ◆ 55% matriculated to 4 year colleges
- ◆ 38% matriculated to 2 year colleges
- ◆ 7% selected military service, work and/or trades
