### Ladarica Maclin Makes Dean List

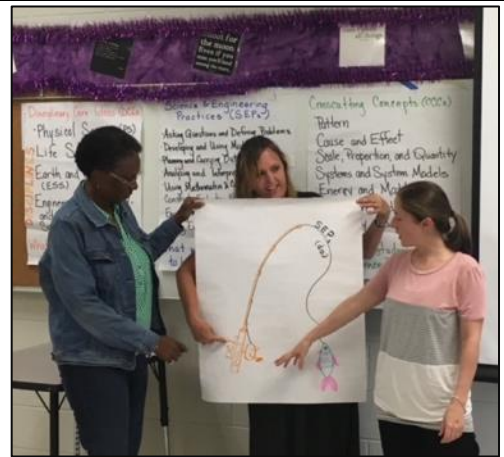

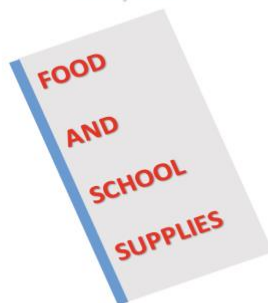
