Reading Strategies

What is the purpose of reciprocal reading?

The purpose of reciprocal teaching is to facilitate **conversation** about text between teacher and students or among students in order to bring meaning to the text. Reciprocal teaching allows students to build a text model by sharing ideas in order to make sense of what they are reading. **Reciprocal Reading makes MEANING!!!**

Strategy

What is "reciprocal reading"?

Reciprocal teaching refers to an instructional activity that takes place in the form of a dialogue or conversation among students regarding segments of text. The conversation is structured by the use of four strategies: **predicting, clarifying, question generating/connecting, and summarizing**. The students take turns assuming the role of teacher in leading this dialogue.
