

CURRICULUM

Curriculum and Instruction Advisory Council

The governing Board recognizes that citizen advisory councils enable the Board to understand better the beliefs, attitudes, and opinions held by members of the community. The Board has a history of forming such committees and has found them helpful. In this instance the Board directs the superintendent/designee to form a Curriculum and Instruction Advisory Council so that parents and other interested citizens may work closely with the teaching and administrative staffs.

The CIAC shall serve in an advisory capacity making recommendations for curriculum, instruction, and policy. Each of these recommendations will be given careful consideration but cannot be binding on the Board.

The council should include representation from affected members of the community and/or community organizations. The superintendent will chair the CIAC and have the power to appoint some of the members (see AR 6141.6).

Within budget allocations, the Superintendent or designee may approve requests for committee travel and may reimburse committee members for expenses.

The Board may dissolve at any time any committee or council not required by law.
