6.a.1. Accept the Resolution No. 36/2018-2019 Implementing Certificated Layoff and Terminating Services of Certificated Employees

Recommended Motion:

Administration recommends that the State Administrator approve Resolution No. 36/2018-2019, Implementing Certificated Layoff and Terminating the Services of Certificated Employees in the General Education Program.

Rationale:

On March 6, 2019, the State Administrator adopted Resolution No. 26/2018-2019, which included discontinuing and reducing particular kinds of services in the general education not later than the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year, as described and set forth in that Resolution. Subsequently, appropriate notifications pursuant to Education Code Sections 44949 and 44955 were delivered to the certificated employees identified for reduction or elimination of services.

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Although several employees requested a hearing to determine whether cause exists for the termination of their services, the requests were withdrawn. Thus, all employees who received a preliminary layoff notice have waived their right to a hearing and all jurisdictional requirements for proceeding with a layoff have been met.

By approving Resolution No. 36/2018-2019, the State Administrator (a) affirms there is sufficient cause for the termination of up to 34.0 full-time equivalent (FTE) certificated positions, and pursuant to and within the meaning of Education Code section 44949, said cause relates to the welfare of the schools and the pupils thereof; and (b) authorizes the District to provide a final notice of layoff to the employees listed in the resolution and reduce certificated particular kinds of services necessary to maintain fiscal solvency.

It is important to note that the District has received several resignations/retirements from certificated employees for the coming school year. As a result, the number of employees receiving a final layoff notice is less than the number that received initial notices in March, 2019. Human Resources is committed to rescinding layoff notices and call back employees from the layoff list in a timely manner when vacancies exist.
