WHAT KIND OF ACTIVITIES ARE IMPORTANT?

- Extra-curricular: Athletics, Arts, Activities (clubs)
 - Quality Participation and *Commitment* in one or few activities
- Service to the Community – volunteering, internships
- Represent/Take on a Leadership Position (shows responsibility & a growth mindset-builds your collaboration skills)
- **Employment:** Working with other personalities, discover strengths and limitations-tolerance for your environment or lack thereof
- Hobbies
- SUMMER Enrichment Programs, EMPLOYMENT & Internships

* STRIKE BALANCE between academics & activities

NCAA ELIGIBILITY

- REGISTER WITH ELIGIBILITY CENTER DURING SOPHOMORE YEAR
- MEET WITH YOUR COUNSELOR OR ONE OF THE NCAA COORDINATORS (MR. FAGAS, MR GYEPES OF MR. MCMILLAN) TO MAKE SURE YOU ARE TAKING THE CORRECT CLASSES
- GET A COPY OF NCAA BROCHURE (SHOULD ARRIVE IN SEPTEMBER) TO MAKE SURE YOU ARE AWARE OF NCAA REQUIREMENTS.

ASKING FOR A LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION FOR A UNIVERSITY OR SCHOLARSHIPS???

- **What institutions require letters?**
- Private Universities (e.g., LMU, USC, Boston College):
 - COMMON APP/PARCHMENT/SENDEDU
- UC/CSU's do not require letter* (unless it is EOP/Community Scholarship)

FORMS NEEDED FROM COUNSELOR AND USUALLY 2 FACULTY/TEACHERS:

- Brag sheet &/or interview w/ counselor - **PLEASE TYPE!!!!**
- Resume - **MUST BE TYPED!!!!!**
 - Senior Year Deadlines to Request Letter
 - 9/28 (Early Action/Decision)
 - 11/9 (Regular Admissions Decision)

CONSIDER ...

Ask previous academic teachers 10th - 11th grade who can speak strongly about you as a student or speak to significant experiences you have had with them.

DO NOT REQUEST A Letter Via Email!
