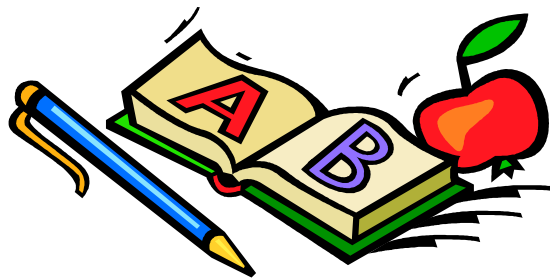
What is Title I?
