Minutes of Regular Meeting
May 10, 2012

The Garvey School District Board of Education met in regular session on May 10, 2012, at Garvey Intermediate School, Rosemead, California.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m., by Board President Tony Ramos.

ROLL CALL

Present at the meeting were Mr. Bob Bruesch, Ms. M. Janet Chin, Mr. Henry Lo, Mr. Tony Ramos, Mr. John Yuen (arrived at 6:32 p.m.), and Superintendent Dr. Sandra Johnson.

Also in attendance were Mr. Genaro Alarcon, Mr. Michael Coughlin, Ms. Dolores Preciado, Dr. Mary Suzuki, and Ms. María De La Cruz.

VISITORS PRESENT

Present as visitors were the persons listed on the attached Register of Attendance who signed the register and whose signatures were legible and which is hereby made an official part of these minutes.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG

Henry Lo led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION

The Board presented certificates of recognition to students from Hillcrest School, Gold Medal Winners, who participated in the L.A. County Science Olympiad, and to principal Dr. Robin Libby, and teacher Teresa Chow. The students recognized were:

Dr. Libby stated that this is the first time Hillcrest students gain more than 500 points out of a total of 600 points. Students compete among 40 elementary schools around the County of Los Angeles.

Bob Bruesch made comments about the need for students to be involved in investigative science during the early grades to attain the skills needed to pursue a career in science.

The Board presented a certificate of recognition to the staff, students, and parents of Hillcrest School for being awarded the Distinguished School Award in 2011-2012. Mr. Libby indicated that this is a collaborative effort involving the students, parents, teachers and school staff. An awards ceremony was recently held at the Pacific Palms Hotel, City of Industry with State Superintendent Tom Torlakson presenting certificates and a plaque. A school celebration is scheduled at Hillcrest School on May 30, 2012.

The Board presented a certificate of recognition to Justin Phan, 3rd Place Winner of the L.A. County Spelling Bee in 2011-2012; and to principal Dr. Wendy Molina-Solis and teacher-coach Shannon Cross.

Ms. Molina-Solis stated that this year is the first time that a District student participating in the Spelling Bee Contest won 3rd place. Student Phan stated that the misspelled word was “vicarious”.

COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS FROM THE BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Sandra Johnson spoke about a Teacher Appreciation Luncheon by the San Gabriel Kiwanis today at the San Gabriel Hilton. Dr. Johnson, Dr. Wendy Molina-Solis, and a teacher representing Dewey School teachers attended the luncheon.

Janet Chin addressed the nominating committee of the Los Angeles County School Trustees Association to select three officers and five directors during the LACSTA Annual Association Dinner of May 17, 2012, being held at The Proud Bird Restaurant in the Los Angeles Airport area.

Henry Lo talked about a press conference in support of Proposition 29 to put a dollar tax increase on cigarette for cancer research and tobacco prevention. Mr. Lo indicated that Garvey School District is one of the first school districts to implement a wellness program which includes teaching students about the effects of tobacco. Mr. Lo urged everyone to vote yes on Proposition 29.

Tony Ramos welcomed everyone that attended tonight’s meeting and asked people to be considerate. He stated that there would be no yielding of time to speak and that the late requests would not be honored. Mr. Ramos reminded everyone that this is a meeting in public and not a public meeting.

Mr. Ramos gave his apologies to Mr. Yuen for not being able to control some of the public remarks that were demeaning, racial, and humiliating at the last Board meeting. He also apologized to Dr. Johnson for an inappropriate and disrespectful remark made by a student. Mr. Ramos commented about a comment about one of Garvey teacher’s Facebook page.

REPORT FROM UNION REPRESENTATIVES

- **Garvey Education Association (GEA)**

Michael Drange, president of GEA, addressed the Board regarding a letter he sent on behalf of GEA to the M. Janet Chin Foundation asking for an explanation of a \$25,000 donation to the District. The Foundation’s response was that donations were made in kind and not cash.

Mr. Drange commented about the message being flashed for the audience to see regarding the norms for the Board Meeting. He indicated there was a conflict with the Board’s Bylaws in without filling out of paperwork during public comments and when an agenda is being discussed. Mr. Drange asked about the Board Agenda being moved out of order without an explanation to the audience.

Mr. Drange read aloud the GEA Report that related to:

- Issues that GEA has with Dr. Johnson
- The layoff of 30 teachers
- A 96 percent vote on GEA Resolution No. 11-12-01, dated April 26, 2012, regarding Dr. Johnson’s management style recommending a vote of no confidence.

Mr. Drange acknowledged the presence of Dr. Roz Collier, president of Alhambra Teachers Association.

- **California School Employees Association (CSEA)**

Olivia De Leon, vice president of CSEA, Chapter 292, read aloud her report, about the crucial roles that each classified employee plays. Ms. De Leon encouraged Board members to approve the resolution proclaiming Classified Employees Week on May 20-26, 2012. She invited Board members to participate in several events and celebrations during this week. A CSEA video titled, *Classified School Employees – a Legacy of Service*, will be shared with the Board later.

REPORT FROM HEAD START REPRESENTATIVE

Cindy Carter-Bedoya, Director of Child Development Office, addressed the Board regarding the status of recent events and information regarding the Head Start/State Preschool Program. She stated that analyst Anne Dumault from the Community Care Licensing Division visited two sites including Duff and Williams Schools. Student files and required postings were reviewed. An inspection was made of indoor/outdoor facilities. Ms. Dumault was impressed with the cleanliness of Williams School and the work of program staff. There were no findings from either school site but one issue related to facility licensing was brought up. The program serves 45 children and an additional part-day class is able to serve 19 students that would include a licensing fee for 54 children. Ms. Dumault returned to visit Sanchez School and identified no findings there.

Ms. Carter-Bedoya spoke about a Head Start Learning Resource fair on Saturday, May 19, 2012, from 10 am to 3 pm at Exposition Center. A bus is being rented to transport 82 children. The fair is targeting children from zero to five years-old with family activities and games for the children. Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE) will reimburse us for the cost of the bus for this event and is an opportunity to opportunity to aid in the enrollment. Ms. Carter-Bedoya indicated that Ursula Ng, LACOE, made a visit to the District today regarding some findings in the area of fiscal, ERSEA and PDM that are in need of correction. These findings will be included in the self-assessment that will be re-submitted to the Board.

Ms. Carter-Bedoya stated that LACOE will be sending monthly monitoring reports directly to the Board president as part of LACOE's commitment to our District.

Ms. Carter-Bedoya indicated that May 25th will be a non-class day for staff development and staff appreciation. The next Head Start Policy Committee meeting will be on May 16, 2012, at 9:00 a.m.

REPORTS FROM DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVES

- **Garvey Council PTA**

Cathie Camacho, president of Garvey Council PTA stated that the next meeting will be on May 16, 2012. She encouraged all parents and teachers to attend the meeting.

- **Garvey Education Foundation**

Michael Coughlin stated that the final report on the proceeds from the Foundation's Gala Awards Dinner will be provided at the next Board meeting.

HEARING OF PERSONS IN THE AUDIENCE

Chuck Hurley, his wife, his son, and Carol Brotsky addressed the Board regarding an E-mail sent to District employees. Mr. Hurley stated that on April 27, 2012, an anonymous letter was sent with slanderous remarks about Ted Saulino, a 40-year retired employee, former student of the District, and a current property owner in the District. Mr. Hurley stated that the letter was sent to ban Mr. Saulino from speaking at Board meetings. Mr. Hurley read aloud the E-mail letter from United Parents of Garvey School District.

Terry Skotnes, executive director of Garvey Education Association, addressed the Board regarding Reduction In-Force (RIF) letters. He spoke about a petition with 1.2 million signatures that was turned in to Governor Jerry Brown to save public education. Mr. Skotnes urged Board members to do some deep soul searching during closed session and consider the concerns from the people and the turmoil caused from replacing a respectable school leader at Willard School. Mr. Skotnes asked the Board to rescind the layoffs and work to get the funding that the District needs.

Mary Jo Watkins addressed the Board regarding layoffs. She pleaded for the job of Rebecca Chien, a nurse with many duties that require a licensed professional on a daily basis, including the state-mandated health tests for students. Ms. Watkins spoke in appreciation of Ms. Preciado's active leadership and dedication to making a positive impact on the lives of students.

Rongwu Liu (Mandarin translator David Jung) addressed the Board in support of Rebecca Chien. He indicated that Ms. Chien has been very helpful with his daughter's health difficulties and medical issues; that many Chinese-speaking parents are in need of Ms. Chien's skills and communication abilities.

Gun Yun He (Mandarin translator David Jung) addressed the Board in support of Rebecca Chien. She spoke of the many ways Ms. Chien has helped her children during times of illnesses.

Bob Bruesch indicated that he received a petition on this issue, as well as, Dr. Johnson.

Gwen Tambe addressed the Board regarding layoffs and in support of Michelle Collaso as an effective leader and team builder. She spoke of unity at Willard School that is fostered through a sense of stability brought to school by Ms. Collaso. Ms. Tambe stated that Ms. Collaso has had time for the students, parents, and teachers, and has inspired and persuaded many staff members to work hard and to do what is right, even when we are facing uncertainty and budget cuts.

Pat Kasababian addressed the Board regarding collaboration in the District and efforts to run the District as a corporate business and not a public institution. She indicated that people are afraid to speak and are now silent for fear of retribution, feeling discounted and intimidated; that the Board is allowing the power of a few to run this District.

Gail Hargroves addressed the Board regarding her concern for Physical Education and in support of Lindsey Sotero. Ms. Hargroves spoke of Ms. Sotero's expertise and experience, and the potential District liability caused by problems of boys and girls not being supervised in the locker rooms and issues related to cell phones, cameras, and possible bullying.

Roz Lynn Collier, president of Alhambra Teachers Association, addressed the Board regarding the path that our School District is taking which is not only hurting students but fracturing relationships in the community. She spoke of Education Code 35161 relating to the schools' authority to execute powers of discharge duties and delegation to an officer or employee of the school district. Ms. Collier talked of the current climate of negativity and paralysis in the District and GEA's no confidence vote of the Superintendent. Ms. Collier asked the Board to join a coalition to gather signatures for a petition on the November ballot to avoid having the District lose \$1 million dollars.

Yoel Dan addressed the Board regarding change of rental fees at Margaret Duff School that could triple, causing him to move his services out of the District or close his music program and leaving approximately 700 children and parents out on the streets without this after-school music program.

Cecilia Losoya addressed the Board regarding loss of cooperation and repeating problems. She asked Board members to start listening and to work for the District as a family unit.

Raquel Galan addressed the Board regarding approval to distribute information to students. She stated there are different sets of rules for some people. Ms. Galan said that her previous comments about Mr. Yuen were not being racist but had more to do with the volume of his voice and accent. Ms. Galan talked about the need for an apology to a young woman in Junior High that had the courage to speak at the last Board meeting. Ms. Galan asked to re-think the learning practices so students can be ready for their tests and help to raise their scores. Ms. Galan stated the Board is not being respectful of the associations' presidents who speak for the employees and she commented on the return of a Teacher Appreciation cake from Board Members sent to Willard School this week.

John Yuen commented on his heavy accent and the difficulty that many people have in speaking perfect English. He asked everyone to always talk with mutual respect and he assured everyone that the Board tries to listen to everyone with respect.

Gloria Lopez completed a Request to Speak but was not present when called to speak.

Pat Molina, daughter Amanda, and son Oscar, addressed the Board regarding all the teachers at Garvey that have helped her and her children succeed. She thanked them for their challenging, nurturing and caring way of teaching and learning. As a parent, she spoke on behalf of the two nurses who are leaving the District. Ms. Molina asked for information on the music program of previous speaker, Yoel Dan.

Mr. Garcia, completed a Request to Speak but was not present when called to speak.

Janet Chin, addressed the Board regarding the different concerns addressed tonight. She thanked Marissa Velasquez from the San Gabriel Valley Tribune for attending the meeting. She spoke of the anger expressed tonight and stated she is disheartened about many people in the District, including Cabinet members. Ms. Chin talked about the lack of growth in Garvey leaders and attacks being made on her.

On the motion of Henry Lo, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board adjourned at 9:54 p.m. to closed session and addressed those items posted on the agenda.

The Board reconvened in public at 11:45 p.m.

Reports and Information Items

- A. Dr. Mary Suzuki gave an update on the Local Education Agency (LEA) Plan –Nine Essential Components. She indicated that the District is in corrective action, year three, and certain aspects of the LEA Plan are required to be reviewed seeking further refinements of the plan. Dr. Suzuki spoke of the progress the District has made in relation to these nine essential components set by the California State Department of Education. The LEA Plan is required to be reviewed and updated on an annual basis. 14

Dr. Suzuki addressed each one of the Nine Essential Components of the LEA Plan and the accomplishments made. She thanked the Educational Technology Office for their support in implementing the online instructional curriculum and textbook materials. Dr. Suzuki spoke of the next steps related to 7-8 grade level mathematics, the Honors English Language curriculum, and development of 7-8 grade social studies and science GATE cluster classes with increased support and in-depth activities, as well as, plans to create and revise the English Language learner benchmarks. Dr. Suzuki talked about the E-Rate funded programs that benefit the students in the District. She invited everyone to the upcoming supplemental materials fair.

On questions from Bob Bruesch regarding Response to Intervention (RTI), Dr. Suzuki stated that all English learner students are able to learn in many different ways, and the District will continue to do all that can be done to modify the teaching and support needed for student improvement. Students are able to share in discussions emphasizing student engagement. Dr. Suzuki stated that concerns about pacing guides are being addressed with resource teachers. She addressed Mr. Bruesch's concern about benchmarks and student assessments. Mr. Bruesch spoke of an E-mail from a parent regarding student testing stating, "I hope we don't destroy the child's joy in learning."

Janet Chin spoke in support of providing one-on-one technology for 7th and 8th grade students and adding Spanish classes for kids in the early grades.

Henry Lo asked about Component No. 4, facilitator skills for administrators. Dr. Suzuki stated that as part of Program Improvement, Becky Wetzel was able to obtain a waiver for eight sessions that entailed facilitator skills as ways of getting input and making sure the use we find out what people are thinking. Our staff is using these skills to go through the improvement process and be able to share with each other the strategies and steps to evaluate and move forwards with reaching the goals in the District.

On the motion of Henry Lo, seconded by Bob Bruesch, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board voted to waive the bylaws and extend the meeting to 12:00 midnight.

- B.** Janet Chin and Keno Deary gave a Report on the M. Janet Chin Youth Foundation. Ms. Chin stated her role as a Garvey School Board member, founder and president of the M. Janet Chin Foundation, and serving on the Board of two other associations. Ms. Chin commented about the Foundations' Facebook page. 15

Keno Deary, executive director of the M. Janet Chin Foundation, and parent of three students in the District, talked about having served as a parent volunteer on several District programs, including former chair of the Head Start Policy Committee. Mr. Deary stated that since 2009, the M. Janet Chin Foundation has supported the Rosemead Youth Leadership Center (RYLC), a youth program that recruits volunteers from high school and college graduates. The RYLC started as a summer program when the Garvey School district was forced to eliminate its summer classes. Today, the RYLC has 72 students from Kindergarten to 8th grade helping students achieve academic success, Monday through Friday, as an after-school program, at a cost of \$135 per month. The program has a waiting list of 30 families. Mr. Keno stated there are no government funds received by this program.

Mr. Deary stated that the request(s) for information on a \$25,000 dollar donation to the District are only as a personal attack on the Foundation's founder and School Board member Janet Chin. In 2010, the M. Janet Chin Foundation began as a subcontractor for the South Bay Workforce that helps men and women who are receiving CALWorks benefits to become ready to re-enter or gain skills necessary for the work force. The program pays \$10 per-hour, 40 hours per week. The \$25,000 dollar donation to the District is mostly in-kind donations and not direct cash donations.

Mr. Deary addressed the discrepancy of hours from what is listed in the RYLC flyer and the operating hours listed in the Facilities Use Request, as well as, questions raised regarding the classrooms assigned to RYLC. Mr. Deary indicated that some terms of the rental agreement were never explained to him. However, he intends to pay approximately \$5,236.20 for undercharges.

Mr. Deary made a public request to the District of information regarding all facility contracts and billing statements for after school programs and summer school programs dating back to 2011.

Mr. Deary made comments regarding GEA's resolution on Dr. Johnson's leadership, noting the impact that this will have on enrollment and parent support.

Henry Lo urged everyone to limit the interaction between the speaker and the audience. Tony Ramos asked for a 10-minute recess before Mr. Deary's completion of his report. Mr. Deary was escorted out of the room.

Janet Chin spoke in support of the Youth Foundation as a dream that she has had since she was ten years-old; a dream that began in 2006 prior to being on the Garvey School Board to share and give back to the community. Ms. Chin stated that she receives nothing from the Foundation as a non-profit organization and will continue to do what is best for the community. Ms. Chin expressed her anger for today's outburst and the personal attacks to her family.

Henry Lo reminded everyone that public comments are directed to the Board and the need for decorum and to follow protocol. Mr. Coughlin answered Mr. Lo's questions on payments expected and the process of approval and oversight of Facility Use Requests. Dr. Johnson will bring back future recommendations to the Board regarding this matter. Bob Bruesch asked for a review of the after-school programs and their fee structures for discussion at a future board meeting.
