One of our most important endeavors at Carlisle Elementary is to ensure that every child wants to come to school to engage with others in learning. In order to accomplish this goal, we recognize the need to actively engage parents and caregivers in the educational lives of their children.

Your children spend a great deal of their waking hours at school. Here are some questions you can ask your children about their day in order to avoid the “nothing” response we sometimes receive when asking what they did today. Encourage them to expand their answers and provide specific examples. You’ll be amazed to learn how much information you can glean from these simple, rephrased questions.

- What made you smile today?
- What do you know today that you didn’t know yesterday?
- How were you brave today?
- What were your top two things from the day?
- What are you looking forward to tomorrow?
- What are you reading?
- What are you writing?
- What made you feel proud?
- What is something that challenged you today?
- Did someone fill your bucket today?
- Whose bucket did you fill?
- What was the book about that your teacher read today?

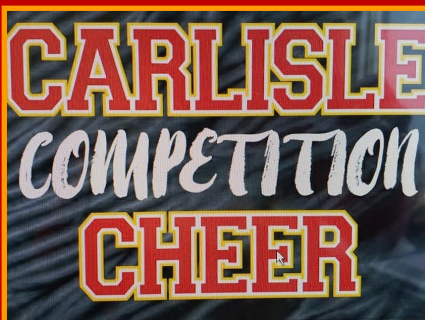

If your student is involved in an activity that practices over at the elementary, we provide transportation for them after school. You will pick them up at the elementary when practice is over. We encourage everyone to get involved in a winter activity!

All athletes need to have a current physical on file to be eligible to participate. In order for a physical to be current, it must be dated within the past year. Once it expires, you have a 30-day grace period to get us a new one in order for your student to continue participation in an activity. According to state law, if an athlete does not have a physical, they are not eligible to participate until it is complete and current. We have some athletes who have physicals that will expire during the season, please make sure they stay current.

Students clearly organize their data, findings and thoughts in both written and oral communication.

Students form a deep commitment to learning as a lifelong process- develop academic perseverance- search for solutions to overcome obstacles.
