How the Program Works

PBIS provides teachers and other school staff with information to help prevent behavioral

problems and help to make school a safe learning environment.

- All students and staff are taught school-wide expectations.
- Students will receive frequent reviews of the expectations and be acknowledged when they demonstrate them (Noble Knight tickets will be given).
- Most of the contact that students have with adults in the building is positive and prevents problem behavior from occurring.
- A PBIS school provides a consistent, predictable and fair use of consequences for all students.
