San Marino is a small suburban residential community northeast of Los Angeles. The internationally renowned Huntington Library is located in the city, and Caltech is nearby. Scheduling conflicts sometimes prevent qualified students from taking available Honors and AP courses. Humanities Seminar and Caltech Stem Research courses are restricted in size, and participants are selected through a competitive application process. AP Psychology and AP European History were permitted online as of September 2010.
