



Parent Technology Agreement

Parent/Guardians,

Buhler Public Schools seeks to provide our students with experience using a wide variety of current technologies throughout their time here. This includes access to laptops, tablets, robotics, green screens, 3D printing, and more. In addition to accessing digital curriculum, these technologies allow students to practice creativity, problem solving, and communication in a variety of ways.

Students are taught online safety at our schools through digital citizenship lessons and all internet access at our schools is filtered in compliance with the Federal Children's Internet Protection Act. We ask for you to partner with us to help ensure that your student uses all technology safely, respectfully, and appropriately, at school and at home. Please sign your intention to follow the guidelines below to the best of your ability.

- Discuss and reinforce safe and ethical/legal technology, internet, and social media use with your child at home.
- Encourage appropriate technology use while at school.
- Supervise your student's use of any district provided device they use at home.
- Ensure that your student reports any mechanical or technical issues with district technology in a timely manner.
- Ensure that your student understands the policies and expectations regarding student use of technology.
- Return any district technology device checked out to your student to the school when requested or upon expulsion, withdrawal from school, or at the end of each school year.
- Provide payment for any damage done to technology checked out to your student. (Buhler USD 313 will cover ONE instance of accidental damage up to \$75 during their time with us)
- Understand that if your student is allowed to bring a personal device to school, the same internet and technology use expectations apply. (USD 313 is not responsible for any damaged, lost, or stolen devices.)

Buhler USD 313 requires that students know where any district technology or accessories assigned to them are at all times and that they bring the device to school fully charged each day.
