<p>Read a book to your child.</p> <p>After reading the book ask your child the following questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who was in the story? • Where did the story take place? • What happened in the story? • How did the story end? • Did you like the story? Why or why not? 	<p>Draw a picture with your child.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After completing the drawing write a sentence or two about the drawing with your child. • Your child’s need for support will depend upon his/her developmental writing stage. • Some children will be able to tell you the first sound that they hear in a word and the corresponding letter. Others will be able to spell simple words (i.e. the, he, she, a). 	<p>Play a learning game with your child.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children learn through play, and games are a great way to teach children important skills. • Bingo games are a fun way to teach and reinforce important skills such as letter names and sounds, shapes, colors, and simple “sight words.” • Games such as Chutes & Ladders & Candyland are great ways to promote listening and oral language skills. 	<p>Build a structure with your child using Recycled Items.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children love to build things, and this activity is a great way to practice science and math concepts. • Locate some recycled items around your home—old cereal boxes, toilet paper rolls, plastic containers, and foil are great. • Talk with your child to create a plan for a structure. Some ideas include- bridges, homes, skyscrapers, schools, etc. • Work alongside your child as they build; let them take the lead in building so they can practice and develop problem solving skills. 	<p>Free Choice!</p> <p>Choose from among the following fun, developmentally appropriate activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Play a game outside ✓ Visit the library ✓ Create a “pattern” using household items ✓ Cook a meal together ✓ Have fun with music (sing and dance!) ✓ Make a puzzle ✓ Have a puppet show
