

Middle School Summer Reading Pre-Advanced Placement 7th Grade English 2019



Dear Parents of ECISD English Pre-AP students,

As this school year comes to a close, the middle school English teachers here in the Edinburg C.I.S.D. would like to let you know that we have your child's education in mind when we make decisions about summer reading assignments. We understand how important it is for students to develop a love of reading as part of their intellectual growth and future success.

We have high expectations for all our students, but especially for our pre-AP students. Pre-AP classes help prepare students for the rigorous, yet rewarding academic challenges they will face in high school and college. Students need to develop a sense of responsibility and dedication to work to ensure their success—now and for the future.

In order to help develop your child's independent reading skills and critical thinking skills, we require all 6th grade pre-AP, 7th grade pre-AP, and 8th grade English I pre-AP students to read an assigned novel during the summer months. Students will also be required to complete an activity and an essay over their reading, students will be assessed over the novel through tests, essays, and class activities at the beginning of the school year.

All students registered for 6th grade English pre-AP, 7th grade English pre-AP, and English I Pre-AP for the 2019-2020 school year are required to read the assigned novel and complete the corresponding assignment during the summer.

The Summer Reading Assignment is due by the end of the second school week September 6, 2019 followed by an exam on September 13, 2019.

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Scrapbook Activity:


After reading the novel, *The Giver*, you will create a scrapbook using the following format:

- Your scrapbook can be in a traditional scrapbook style or in a folder or binder filled with 3-5 8 x 11 papers. In general, scrapbooks are decorative and contain many illustrations. Pictures may be images from the computer, newspapers, magazines, or they may be hand drawn illustrations. If they are hand drawn, please do them yourself. Your name, book title, and author's name should be on the cover of the scrapbook.

- Your scrapbook will be divided into four sections:
 1. Characters – This section will contain pictures and character descriptions of each of the following characters: Jonas, Lily, Mother, Father, Asher, Gabriel, and Giver.
 2. Setting – Identify 3 major settings of the story and have a visual depiction of each setting. Describe each setting and list a minimum of three important events that occurred in that setting.
 3. Letter – Write a letter from one character to another. Your letter must be at least one page long and can be either hand written or typed. It must be in letter format and include a date relevant to the novel, salutation, body, and closing. Also, include an envelope with addresses indicating where the letter is coming from and where it is going. The letter must be based on the novel and be written from and addressed to characters from the novel. The topic of the letter might be an issue of importance from the story or it might describe and explain an incident from the story. Be sure to explain the character's feelings about the issue or incident and make it clear how the issue or incident impacted the character's life.
 4. Keepsakes – Choose 5-7 images or artifacts that Jonas and Giver would collect to add in their own scrapbook to remember one another. Write a short 3-5 words description for each keepsake. Make sure to distinguish which images/artifacts are collected by Jonas and Giver.



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Things to keep in mind:

- The captions in the scrapbook should be clear and descriptive.
- All items in the scrapbook should be relevant to the story.
- The scrapbook should indicate a full understanding of the novel.
- The scrapbook should demonstrate creativity, be well presented and inviting.
- The scrapbook should be free of grammatical and spelling errors. Punctuation should be applied correctly.
- The scrapbook should be free of offensive language and inappropriate pictures or ideas.

Scrapbook Grading Rubric

_____ 100-90%: Insightful, creative, colorful, thorough, follows all directions, no spelling or grammatical errors, neat and provides textual evidence.

_____ 80-70%: Adequate, some creativity shown, follows most directions, no more than 5 spelling or grammatical errors, neat and provides textual evidence


_____ 60-50%: Simplistic interpretation, lacking sufficient creativity or effort, over 5 grammatical errors, does not follow major parts of the directions and average textual evidence.

_____ 40-30%: Insight or interpretation is incorrect, lacking creativity and effort, does not follow directions, errors affect meaning of project and insufficient textual evidence.

_____ 20-0%: Lacking creativity, effort, and insight, does not follow directions, partially completed project, did not submit project and no sign of textual evidence.

- clearly state your controlling idea
- organize and develop your explanation effectively
- choose your words carefully
- use correct spelling, capitalization, punctuation, grammar, and sentences

Connections from the novel along with personal connections must be included to support your explanations.

This essay can be handwritten or TYPED (double spaced, Times New Roman Font and 12 size font) and must be 1 ½ pages long. A cover page will also be required.
