Bond plans include modernized science labs at 3 campuses

One of the most important upgrades included in the COCISD bond proposal is the construction of new science labs and classrooms at three campuses in the district.

Lincoln Junior High opened its doors more than 50 years ago. Many LJH parents remember attending classes in the same lab as their kids do now, with much of the same equipment.

Coldspring-Oakhurst High School's lab is a far distance from the classrooms, so teachers have to transport equipment and learning materials cross-campus. It was completed almost 20 years ago.

If the bond passes, Lincoln Junior High will have a new science wing with a modernized lab and classrooms. Coldspring-Oakhurst High School will have a new science lab and classrooms housed in the current wing that faces State Hwy 105 West, and Coldspring Intermediate School will also get a renovated science lab.
