What is SAP?

The primary goal of the SAP Team is to help students overcome barriers affecting their opportunity to learn. Issues with alcohol, tobacco, other drugs, and mental health may be addressed in order that they may achieve, remain in school, and advance.

Four Phases of SAP:

Referral – Anyone can refer a student to SAP when they are concerned about someone’s behavior. The SAP team contacts the parent for permission to proceed with the process

Team Planning – The SAP team gathers objective information about the student’s performance in school from all school personnel who have contact with the student. A plan is developed that includes strategies for removing the learning barriers and promoting the student’s academic and personal success.

Intervention and Recommendations: The plan is put into action. The team assists in linking the student to in-school and/or community-based services and activities. The team might recommend a drug and alcohol or mental health assessment.

Support and Follow-Up: The SAP Team continues to work with and support the student and family. Follow-up includes monitoring, mentoring, and motivating for academic success.

Who is referred to SAP?

There are many reasons, which may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Academic performance
- School attendance
- Disruptive behavior
- Unusual behavior
- Peer problems
- Use/Suspected use of Drugs and/or Alcohol
- Frequent themes of death/dying
- Personal problems
- Change in physical appearance or demeanor
- Death of family member/friend

The SAP Team meets weekly, or more often as necessary, to identify, intervene, with and assist students and families with seeking appropriate assistance. The SAP Team reviews all referrals and a formal information gathering begins. Objective data is collected from:

- Parents
- Student Records
- Teachers
- School Counselors
- School Nurse
- School Administration
- Other School Personnel

CONFIDENTIALITY

An important aspect of the SAP process is CONFIDENTIALITY! The Montour School District respects and maintains confidentiality throughout the SAP process.
