Rochester City School District

There will be 16 sites throughout the city of Rochester providing food.

Nine Rochester R-Centers will be open 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. for grab-and-go food distribution to school-age children:

- Ave D, 200 Ave. D
- Carter St., 500 Carter St.
- Tyshaun Cauldwell, 524 Campbell St.
- Frederick Douglass, 990 South Ave.

Children will be served pre-packaged breakfast, lunch and dinner. School-aged city residents can access these services using their EZ Rec Pass. Those without an EZ Rec Pass will be registered immediately on site.

Brighton

The district is participating in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's School Closure Meal Program, which provides free meals to students during school closure.

It starts Wednesday, March 18, and continues weekdays until schools reopen.

Breakfast will be offered from 7:30 a.m. to 9 a.m., and lunch from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at:

Brighton High School, 1150 Winton Road, Brighton. Go to door 22.
French Road Elementary School, 488 French Road in Brighton.
Parents, guardians, and senior citizens can also purchase meals for \$2 for breakfast or \$4 for lunch.

Brockport

The Brockport Central School District's free student meal program begins Wednesday, March 18. Grab-and-go meals will be available weekdays from 9 a.m. to noon at the west entrance of Brockport High School, 40 Allen St., Brockport. Meals are for Brockport Central School District students 18 and under.

Churchville-Chili

The district is participating in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's School Closure Meal Program, which provides free meals to students during school closure. It will have three meal pickup locations, the Chestnut Ridge School main foyer, Churchville Elementary School back door, #6, and Middle School North Building Door 24. The only requirement is that children must be 18 or younger to receive a meal. Pickup locations will be open from 11 a.m. through 12:30 p.m. on weekdays beginning March 18.

Students in grades 1-6 who do not have access to a device at home will be offered use of a district Chromebook. Communication regarding pickup procedures for Chromebooks will come from each building principal.

If you need to pick up your child's medication, please contact your child's respective school nurse to schedule a pickup time.

East Irondequoit

All six schools in our district will be open for lunch in a "grab and go" setting from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. beginning March 16. On March 17, the school nutrition team will also begin providing breakfast from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m.

These meals are free to anyone 18 and under and will continue until schools reopen. You do not have to be an East Irondequoit resident in order to receive the meals. Adult meals will be available for \$2 at breakfast and \$4 at lunch. Students do not need to be present in order to receive their meals.

East Rochester

The East Rochester School District is participating in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's School Closure Meal Program, which provides free meals to students during school closure. All kids in the community, 18 years and younger, can participate; you need not be an East Rochester resident.

It will begin Wednesday, March 18, and continue until schools reopen.

Breakfast will be served from 8 to 10 a.m. and lunch from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Pickup is in the bus loop of the junior and senior high school, 200 Woodbine Ave., East Rochester.

The lunches are free. There is no income requirements or registration. Parents, guardians, and senior citizens can also purchase a meal for \$2 for breakfast and \$4 for lunch.

The East Rochester Community Resource Center at 33 East Chestnut Street is temporarily expanding its hours; the new hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

It distributes food, clothing and household items on an emergency basis. People must show proof of residence and ID. Food is limited to three bags per family, every two months.

Fairport

Beginning Tuesday, March 17, Fairport Central School District will provide free meals to students in need from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. weekdays at the following locations:

- Pines of Perinton (Learning Links);
- Fairport Police Department (rear parking lot);
- Alpine Knoll (office);
- Knollwood Apartments (office);
- Jefferson Avenue bus loop;
- Fairport High School bus loop.

Lunch for the current day and breakfast for the following day will be available for free to all children ages 3 through 18. Look for a Fairport school bus or a district representative at each location.

Gates Chili

Gates Chili will provide free meals for any child under the age of 18. There are no income requirements and you don't need to be a Gates Chili resident to pick up meals.

The to-go meals will be served at Gates Chili Middle School, 2 Spartan Way, Gates; Paul Road Elementary School, 571 Paul Road; and Walt Disney Elementary School, 571 Paul Road. Weekday lunch will be served from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. beginning March 17. Weekday breakfast will be served 8 to 10 a.m. beginning March 18.

Greece
