ACT*	Senior Retake: 10/2/18  HS Juniors: 4/2/19  HS Juniors testing with accommodations: 3/12/19 - 4/30/19	English, Math, Reading, Science, Writing	The ACT is used to measure academic readiness for college and HOPE scholarship eligibility.	Student-level reports are provided to students approximately 3-8 weeks after the assessment by ACT.
Advanced Placement Exams	5/6/19 – 5/17/19	AP Courses	AP tests are can be used to award credit or determine placement upon entering college.	Scores are available online in July from The College Board.
ASVAB	9/25/2018	Science, Math, Word Knowledge, Reading Comprehension, <b>Mechanical</b> Comprehension and Electronics Information.	The ASVAB is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military.	Score Reports are provided 2-3 weeks after assessment.
Civics*	2018 – 2019	U.S. History, Civics	This is a state-mandated test and also a Graduation Requirement beginning with the class of 2017.	Students will receive their scores within 2 weeks of testing. Opportunities to retest will be available throughout the year.

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EasyCBM Universal Screener for RTI <sup>2</sup>	9/4/18– 9/17/18 12/4/18 – 12/17/18 5/1/19 – 5/22/19	Reading, Math	This benchmark test of reading and mathematics is given by the district three times per year (K-6) and once at the end of the year (Grades 7/8) to all students and is used to monitor the progress of students receiving interventions.	Parents can access results through student's assigned teacher.
Grade 2 TCAP Assessment	4/15/19 – 5/3/19	English/Language Arts, Math	This test is given to help measure how much a second-grade student grows academically over the course of a year.	Fall 2019
Grade 2 TCAP Alt	3/18/19 – 5/3/19	English/Language Arts, Math	This test is given to students in grade 2 with the most significant cognitive disabilities.	Fall 2019
Grades 3-8 TCAP Achievement Assessment*	4/15/19 – 5/3/19	English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science (the required Social Studies Field Test will also be administered during this time)	The TCAP tests are designed to assess true student understanding and not just basic memorization and test-taking skills. TCAP measures student understanding of our current state standards, not the previous SPIs with the exception of science, which is scheduled to have new assessments in the 2017-18 school year.	Fall 2019
Grades 3-8 and Biology (Grade 10) TCAP Alt*	3/18/19 – 5/10/19	Science, Biology (grade 10), Social Studies	This is an alternative achievement test for students in grades 3-8 and grade 10 (biology) with the most significant disabilities for whom participation in the regular state assessment is inappropriate, even with the use of extensive accommodations.	Fall 2019

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Grades 9-12 TCAP End of Course (EOC) Assessments*	4/15/19 – 5/3/19	English I, English II, Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Biology, U.S. History/Geography	The TCAP tests are designed to assess true student understanding and not just basic memorization and test-taking skills. They measure student understanding of our current state standards, not the previous SPIs, with the exception of Biology and Chemistry, which are scheduled to have new assessments in the 2017-18 school year. TCAP EOC assessments are given to help measure how much a student grows academically in a particular content area.	Fall 2019
Grades 3-12 Case21 Benchmark Testing	9/18/18 – 9/25/18 11/12/18 – 11/16/18 2/19/19 – 2/25/19	Math, Science, English/Language Arts, Social Studies	These assessments are used to assess student growth in learning throughout the year.	Parents can access results through student's assigned teacher.
Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA)*	3/18/19 – 5/3/19	English/Language Arts, Math	This is an alternative achievement test for students in grades 3-8 and grade 11 with the most significant cognitive disabilities.	Fall 2019
National Assessment for Educational Progress (NAEP)*	1/28/19 – 3/8/19	Grades 4 & 8 (in selected schools only) Reading, Math	Only a small sample of Tennessee fourth and eighth graders will take this test. The test, often called the Nation's Report Card, measures Tennessee's academic achievement against other states also taking this test.	No student-level results provided.
PSAT	10/24/2018	9 <sup>th</sup> /10 <sup>th</sup> Grade Honors English Students & AP 11 <sup>th</sup> Grade English Students	The <b>PSAT/NMSQT</b> is the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. <b>PSAT</b> scores are used to identify National Merit Scholars and award merit scholarships.	Student results available 6 – 8 weeks after test administration.
