The PACE Character trait for September is Responsibility

One of our expectations at Windsor is *Wildcats are Responsible*. This includes each child being responsible for his/her behavior and work. Here are some suggestions for building responsibility in your child:

- **Don't do everything** for your child. Let him do things for himself. Will mistakes be made? Probably. But those mistakes are opportunities for learning.
- **Don't drop everything** to rescue your child when she forgets things. If she leaves her homework or athletic shoes at home, don't rush them to school. Instead, let her deal with the consequences.

- **Don't try to negotiate** better grades for your child. If you or your child are confused about a grade, expect your child to discuss it with his teacher.
- **Do expect** your child to be responsible. Sit down with your child and plan and decide on tasks she may be ready to handle on her own. These may include going to bed on time, choosing an outfit for school, completing homework, returning forms on time, reading at least 20 minutes a day, and/or taking care of pets.
- **Don't ask for your child** to be excused from consequences for not being a responsible student. If your child doesn't complete assignments at home or school, expect him to complete work at recess or during a preferred activity during the day.
- **Do encourage** your child every day! Learning to be responsible takes time and children benefit from encouragement from the important adults in their lives.

Roasted Honey Carrots

Ingredients

8 full-size carrots, peeled
3 tablespoons olive oil
1/4 cup honey
Salt and black pepper to taste

Directions

Preheat an oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Place the whole carrots into a baking dish, and drizzle with olive oil. Mix until the carrots are completely covered with olive oil. Pour on the honey, then season to taste with salt and pepper; mix until evenly coated. Bake in the preheated oven until just tender, or cooked to your desired degree of doneness, 40 minutes to 1 hour. Serves 4.
