- **2009-10: ESOC window closed on Friday, August 21<sup>st</sup>**
- **2010-11: ESOC window closed on Friday, August 20<sup>th</sup>**
- **2011-12: ESOC window closed on Friday, August 19<sup>th</sup>**
- **2012-13: ESOC window closed on Friday, August 18<sup>th</sup>**
- **2013-14: ESOC window closed on Friday, August 16<sup>th</sup>**

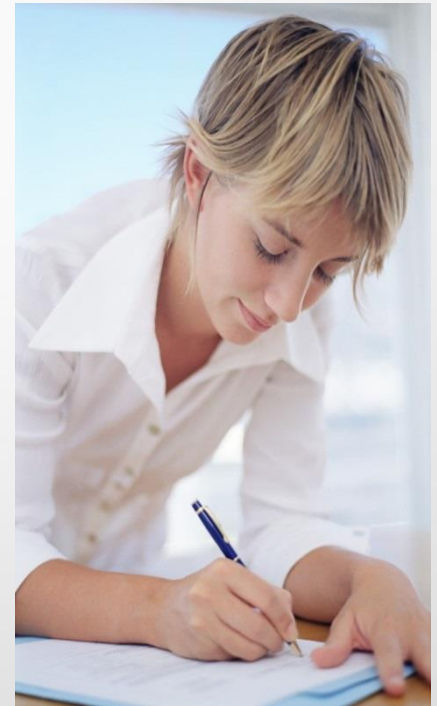

# Registration Process

- ALL new enrollees MUST present evidence of residency (Macomb)
- Registration for ALL new students occurs at the Administration Office
- Resident students are permitted to register and be enrolled at any time during the summer or school year
- Schools of Choice students must apply for admission to Lakeview during the designated window. (Determined by the district in accordance with state law)



# Registration Process



- Background checks are conducted by the Assistant Superintendent and building administrators on the schools of choice (ESOC) applicants
- Academic assessments are given to all incoming new students in grades K-12 (Kdg Snapshots began in 2010 with Placement Testing on students in grades 1-12, implemented in 2011)
- ESOC applicants are notified of their acceptance status after initial background check is complete
- Individuals with clean background checks are given the "OK" to complete the registration process
- Parents/Guardians utilize Gateway (an online registration program) to complete electronic copies of registration papers
- Once the registration packet is completed, the student is placed at a building and if a secondary student, works with building staff to choose their classes

# When Did Most People Register?

- 676 Registration Packets Completed

- (798 students-active in enrollment process for 2018-19 with 662 actually attending.)

\*Even though there were limited openings in some grade levels for the 2018-19 school year, a lottery was not necessary because the number of ESOC applications did not exceed the limit identified for any of the grades.

# Overall Discipline/Behavior

## JMS - 2017-18

- School of Choice students had about the same number of significant offenses within this academic year as Resident Students
- Resident and School of Choice students represent the same number of drug related offenses (Drug paraphernalia, use, possession) = 0 Incidents
- Resident students had more weapon related offenses than School of Choice students (1 incident vs. 0)

# Overall Discipline/Behavior

## LHS - 2017-18

- ❑ Resident students had a slightly higher number of significant offenses than School of Choice students in this academic year
- ❑ School of Choice students had more drug related offenses (Drug paraphernalia, use, possession) than Resident students during 2017-18 (4 incidents vs. 1)
- ❑ School of Choice students had more weapon related offenses during the last school year ( 2 incidents vs. 1)
