5. Increase the percentage of students who “Meet or Exceed” Next Generation Science Standards as measured by a mid-year and end-of-year teacher generated assessment.
6. Increase the percentage of students who “Meet or Exceed” proficiency as measured by a mid-year and end-of-year teacher generated benchmark assessments in all core subjects.
