The activities of the Garden Club will build upon the work started by last year's Garden Club. Students will learn about organic gardening practices, how to enrich the soil "organically" and how to support plant growth and health through natural means. The Club will care for the perennial flowers, strawberries and herbs currently growing in the garden. We will prepare the soil and plant veggies and flowers, many of which we can harvest by our last session.

We are in the midst of a **Maker and Artistic Revolution**. **3D Printing** is an amazing technology that allows *everyone* to design and be an artist/creator. The uses of 3D printing are endless. From doctors and dentists to architects, from designers to artists, 3D printing is already changing the world. In the 3D Jewelry Club, students will use Tinkercad to create 3D models of jewelry. 3D models will be printed, painted, and transformed into wearable jewelry!
