Bond approved to help keep LPPS safe, upgrade aging infrastructure

Bond will support important safety and security enhancements in buildings across the district

Lincoln Park, Mich. — Voters on Tuesday approved the **Safe, Dry, Warm Bond Proposal**, which will support important safety and security enhancements to help keep **Lincoln Park Public Schools** students, staff and families safe.

“The safety of our students, staff and families is our No. 1 priority, and I’d like to thank our community for approving the Safe, Dry, Warm Bond Proposal,” said **Terry Dangerfield**, Lincoln Park Public Schools superintendent. “This bond will help us make important safety and security enhancements and infrastructure upgrades to keep our students safe, dry and warm.”

The bond will:

- Support safety and security enhancements like locking doors and locking windows at many LPPS buildings to increase the safety of our students, staff and families.
- Replace aging infrastructure including roofs, boilers and HVAC/electrical systems.
- Make energy efficiency upgrades in buildings across the district to reduce energy costs.

Lincoln Park Public Schools has a record of transparency, accountability and fiscal responsibility, helping the district remain fiscally stable at a time when public school enrollment is down and districts across the state are being asked to do more with less.

LPPS is one of 36 Michigan school districts recognized by a leading independent municipal research organization for three consecutive years of fiscal stewardship.

All funds raised by the Safe, Dry, Warm Bond Proposal will be listed on a public website to promote transparency and help ensure taxpayer dollars are spent wisely.
